Trademark Merchant Energy, LLC (formerly known as Kansas Energy LLC) is a limited liability company organized under the laws of Delaware.




Exhibit A-16 – "Company History" Trademark Merchant Energy, LLC





















MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

Trademark Merchant Energy, LLC (hereafter, "Applicant") respectfully moves the Commission for a protective order granting confidential treatment to certain materials submitted in the above-captioned proceeding, pursuant to Rule 4901:1-1-24 of the Ohio Administrative Code. In support of said motion, Applicant states as follows:

- 1. As part of its Application for certification as a Competitive Retail Natural Gas Supplier (CRNGS), Applicant has submitted to the Commission, its consolidated 2009, 2010 and 2011-2012 financial statements, its financial arrangements including working capital, letters of credit, and forecasted financial statements for two years of natural gas operations regarding CRNGS.
- 2. The consolidated 2009, 2010 and 2011-2012 financial statements, its financial arrangements including working capital, letters of credit, and forecasted financial statements for two years of natural gas operations regarding CRNGS should all be protected as confidential commercial information. Applicant is a privately held corporation, and does not disclose this information to anyone outside of its corporate affiliates and representatives (with the exception being that financial statements are disclosed on a limited basis to potential customers subject to an appropriate confidentiality agreement for the purpose of obtaining credit).
 - 3. By this Motion, Applicant is seeking confidential treatment of this information, which is called for in the Application as Exhibits C-3, C-4, and C-5 respectively.
- 4. Release of the information that Applicant seeks to protect is likely to result in a competitive disadvantage for Applicant. Competitors possessing the confidential information described above would be aware of the intimate details of Applicant's finances and its strategic allocation of resources for the Ohio natural gas market.

- 5. The Commission has the authority to treat the information described above as confidential, pursuant to Rule 4901:1-1-24 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- 6. Applicant requests that the Commission issue an Order protecting from public disclosure in any form should be prohibited and the protected materials should be returned at the conclusion of the proceeding or destroyed on terms acceptable to Applicant.
- 7. The Commission granted a protective order with respect to the previous filing and motion for confidentiality submitted by Trademark Merchant Energy, LLC under Docket 10-3115-GA-CRS. Applicant requests an extension of the protective order previously granted on April 4, 2011 for an additional period of 24 months.

WHEREFORE, Trademark Merchant Energy, LLC respectfully request that the Commission:

- A. Issue an order treating as confidential the consolidated 2009, 2010 and 2011-2012 financial statements, financial arrangements including working capital, letters of credit, guarantees, forecasted financial statements for two years of natural gas operations in Ohio;
- B. Issue and order to extend the protective order issued on April 4, 2011 for an additional period of 24 months treating as confidential the 2007, 2008 and 2009 combined financial statements, financial arrangements including working capital, letters of credit, guarantees, forecasted financial statements for two years of natural gas operations in Ohio; and
- C. Grant such other and further relief as may be just and equitable.
