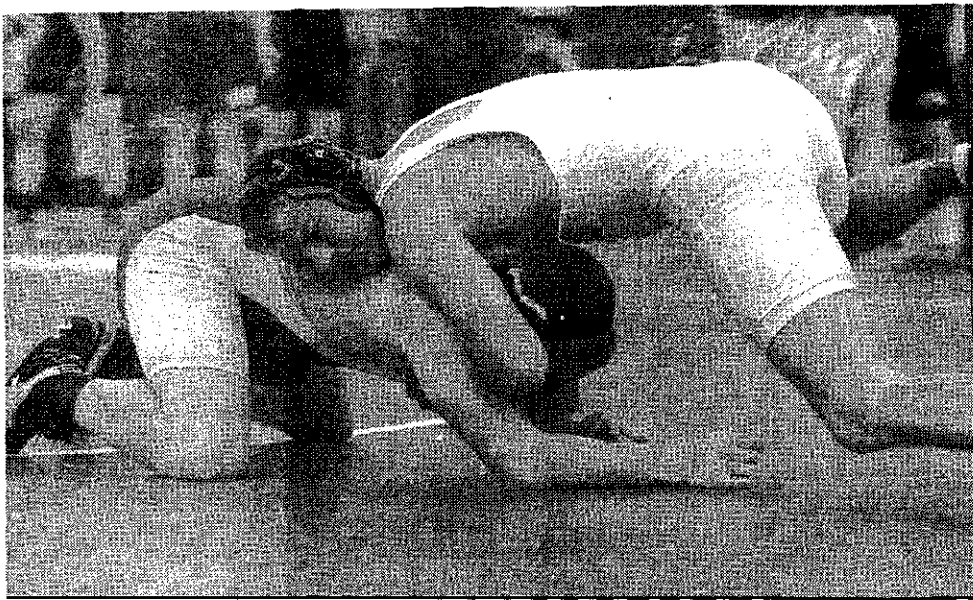

Queen's wallet was taken as well as a money box containing cash and several old coins. The money box was later found near Dundas.

The first to be arrested was Dale Franklin Canter, age 31, of 50 McKinniss Street, Hamden. According to Wellston Police Department Investigator, John Robinson, he is being held in the Jackson County Correctional Facility on multiple warrants from other counties. He was arrested Wednesday, December 12, 2012.

Charged with Aggravated Robbery is Larry T. Hart, Jr., 28, of Athens County, who was arrested December 21.

"We got lots of tips," said Robinson, "and we followed every one. Everyone worked on this case," he added. "Helping were the Jackson and Vinton County Sheriff's offices, the Athens County Sheriff's Office who actually got Hart for us, the Jackson County Municipal Court Probation Department, and State of Ohio Adult Parole Authority...everyone

worked on this with us."

The case will be presented to a Jackson County Grand Jury and Robinson believes additional charges are a probability. Queen has stated publicly he believes his attacker intended to kill him.

Queen received multiple skull fractures in the attack, but has now recovered from his injuries and is considering reopening his office, but under a different mode of operation.

In a recent Letter to the Editor, Queen wrote, "I have been shocked, amazed, and deeply hum-

bled by the great outpouring of concern, compassion, love, and prayers extended to me by the whole community as a result of the attack I suffered which was intended to end my earthly life. There is absolutely no way I can properly express my gratitude. A simple "thank you" seems so totally inadequate yet that is all I can say. THANK YOU-ALL OF YOU! And thanks also to the Wellston Police Department and EMS who responded so quickly and efficiently."


