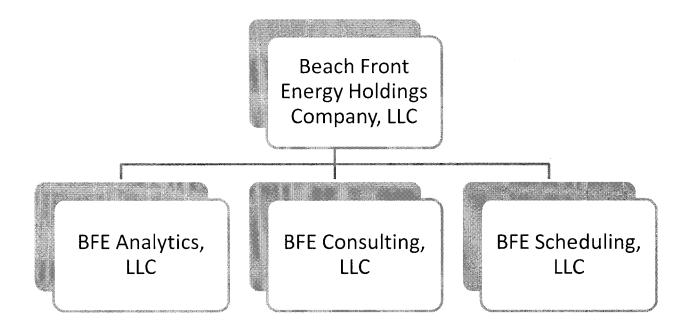

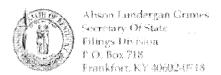

#### **Exhibit B-2 Experience & Plans**

BFE Scheduling, LLC has the necessary technical and managerial resources to comply with all scheduling, operating, planning, reliability, customer registration and settlement policies and procedures established by PJM. BFE Scheduling, LLC has also entered into an agreement with third party provider to ensure the reliability of retail electric service to customers, in accordance with its customer contracts, commission rules, PJM protocols, and other applicable laws.

BFE Scheduling, LLC has sufficient management resources to secure and schedule electric supply, establish an ethical marketing program, provide excellent customer service and responsible fiscal management. BFE Scheduling, LLC will utilize internal staff and outside expertise to fulfill the risk management needs of the company. Detailed information on the qualifications of the individuals is submitted in Attachments D-3.

BFE Scheduling, LLC will hire employees as needed to fulfill all staffing needs, and if necessary, will also employ additional outsourced services. BFE Scheduling, LLC will staff appropriately to ensure that all requirements are met and exceeded. BFE Scheduling, LLC plans to provide outstanding customer service experience for all customers, as well as be completely compliant with all PUCO regulations. BFE Scheduling, LLC will put into place a system of checks and balances to ensure compliance with all PUCO rules. Management will apply oversight and direction to customer service activities.

Management will meet with staff at least monthly to discuss operations and compliance. A system will be put in place to compile regular internal compliance reports and to review these reports on a frequent and regular basis.

BFE Scheduling, LLC will enter into an agreement with an experienced company to provide back-end CIS and EDI functions.

BFE Scheduling, LLC has staff with extensive hands-on experience with both wholesale and retail electric operations, as reflected in D-3, and will utilize its expertise to ensure compliance with policies, rules, guidelines, and procedures established by PJM or other independent organizations.
