competitors.

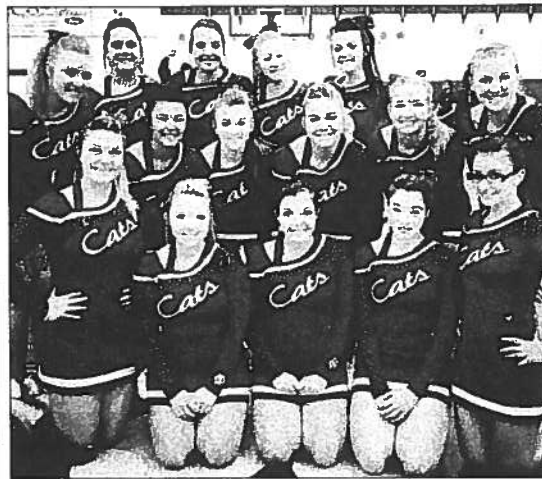
Varsity hip hop and dance squads are in action this weekend, competing at The Ohio State University's St. John Arena as both qualified for state-level competition at regional competition in January.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio and AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio Transco) propose to improve the transmission system in Noble County by installing a new 138-kilovolt (kV) branch from its existing Muskingum River - Summerfield 138-kV line.

The purpose of the project is to provide 138-kV service to a customer in this area. Construction is scheduled to begin in May 2013.

The project is known as the Steamtown 138-kV Loop Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906-11-01, AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the state of Ohio Power Siting Board.

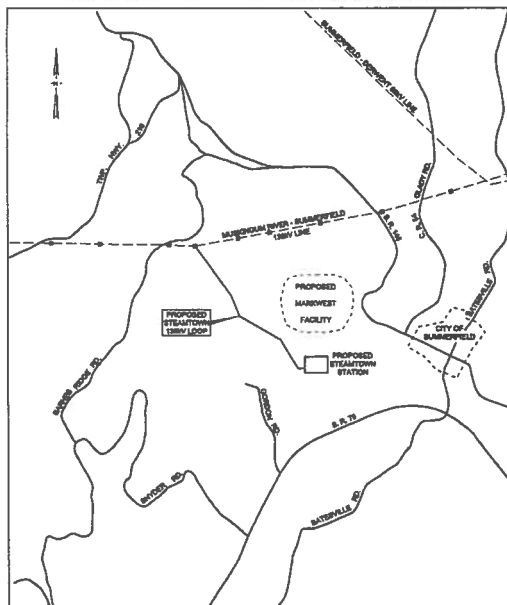
This project qualifies as a Letter of Notification filing because it meets the requirements outlined in OAC 4906-1-01, Item (1)(N) of the Interim Application Requirement Matrix for Electric Power Transmission Lines in Appendix A.

The Letter of Notification for the Steamtown 138-kV Loop Project is pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case Number 13-452-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding.

Petitions to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice required by Rule 4906-5-09(C)(1), OAC. Petitions should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite the above case number.

The Steamtown 138-kV loop transmission line consists of installing approximately 0.8 miles of new double circuit steel structures. The project will be a loop from the existing south circuit of AEP's Muskingum River - Summerfield 138-kV line to the new Steamtown station. The line will tap the Muskingum River - Summerfield line at tower 101 and generally run in a southeast direction.

The new transmission line will be an approximate \$400,000 investment by AEP in its transmission system in the area. The project will allow AEP to continue to provide the level of service its customers expect.



The accompanying map depicts the project area. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide. 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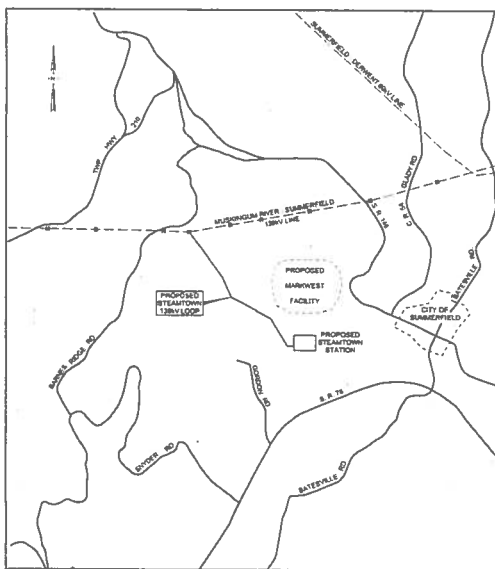
