Dear Ms. McNeal:

Frontier Communications, Inc. is pleased to report that over 85% of the households within the Frontier North Service Area (FNSA) in Ohio are now able to access broadband service provided by Frontier at download speeds of at least 1 MB. See the attached list of 1MB download availability by wire center.

Pursuant to the Stipulation and Recommendation of the Joint Applicants, Staff and the Office of the Ohio Consumers' Counsel in Case No. 09-454-TP-ACO, the Application of Frontier Communications Corporation, New Communications Holdings Inc. and Verizon Communications Inc. for Consent and Approval of a Change in Control, Frontier has met the conditions and requirements of the Broadband Program.

Also, since July 1, 2010 through April 30, 2013, Frontier has made more than \$151 million in capital investments throughout the FNSA in Ohio. Additional capital investments of more than \$4.3 million are planned by June 30, 2013.

These capital investments have not only increased our DSL availability in the state, but they have allowed us to make many improvements to our network including upgrading our backbone fiber network with Reconfigurable Optical Add-Drop Multiplexer or ROADM technology. This technology enables rapid capacity and configuration scalability that provides us with the platform for future broadband deployments and has increased our capacity by more than 80 times.

In addition, we have upgraded the speeds on more than 50 sites across the state to support download speeds of up to 12MB for residential customers and 15MB for business customers and over 30 sites have been upgraded to support download speeds of up to 25MB for residential customers and 40MB for business customers. The enhanced speeds are made possible through the deployment of ADSL 2+ Bonding and VDSL technologies.

With our extensive fiber network and with the use of ROADM technology, we were able to launch Metro Ethernet service to our commercial customers in many areas of the state. Metro Ethernet is a cost-effective way for businesses and organizations to connect multiple locations with reliable and scalable bandwidth, with speeds ranging from 3M to 1G. This service has brought “big city” broadband technology to more than 50 locations in the state, including the communities of Jackson, Cadiz, Bryan and Athens.

We appreciate your enthusiastic support of the expansion of broadband availability in Ohio and look forward driving incremental broadband adoption in the future, which will improve the quality of life of the state’s citizens and help foster economic development.
