flect what our effort is and what our outcome is, "Somerlot said Part of the problem is the levels of management, with 90 centers overseen by 20 work-force investment act areas and ultimately controlled by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, which has little insight into

the operations of individ-ual job placement of fices, according to the audit.

"It's a really complex, dynamic system," Tercz said.

The audit was re-quested by the Gover-nor's Office of Work-force Transformation, a group established to align 91 workforce-relat-

ed programs currently overseen by 13 different state agencies, director Tracy Inthar said The audit confirmed suspicions that the job placement organizations were fragmented and provided disparate services, she said.

Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793. The hearing on June 25, 2013, at the PuCO offices is open to the public, but participation is limited to the parties in the case as defined by ORC 4906 08

This notice is the second notice published regarding this projects respective hearing dates. The first notice was published March 31, 2013, in the Childicothe Gazette.

The application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is pending before the state of Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case Number 12-1361-EL-BSB. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding

AEP is proposing to build the new 345/138/69kV Biers Run Substation in rural Union Town-ship northwest of Chillicothe in Ross County ship northwest of Chillicothe in Ross County, make improvement at several existing substations, upgrade existing threatments of the station o

The Biers Run Project is a major transmission reinforcement project designed to help AEP maintain an adequate level of transmission reliability in southern Ohio. The new Biers Run Substation will allow AEP to address reliability concerns about potential low voltages abrity concerns about potential low voltages and thermal overloads under certain conditions. Without this substation, in a worst case scenario, uncontrolled widespread power outlages affecting major portions of southern Ohio may materialize. AEP studies indicate that without this reinforcement plan, the performance of the company's treamplified in the performance of the company's treamplified in the performance of the company's treamplified in the performance of the company's performance of the performance of the company's performan that without this reinforcement plan, the per-formance of the company's transmission sys-tem will be inadequate to provide the level of service that its customers expect.

To resolve these issues, AEP has proposed and PJM — the regional transmission organi-zation to which AEP belongs — has approved a baseline project to construct the new 345/138/69-kV Biers Run Substation; to build two new 138-kV circuits, one from Biers Run



Station to Circleville Station and other from Station to Cuclevitle Station and other from Biers Run to Belano Station and how new 58-kV curcuits to reinforce the 138-kV and 69-kV transmission systems in the ama. These new ratifities will provide the much necede volt-age and thermal capacity support, as well as ensure near-and long-term transmission refi-ebility for the area. The proposed Biers Run Substation will be Incated between Biers Run Road and State Route 35.

A separate application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need will be submitted for the proposed 138-kV transmission lines later this year Details about these proposed transmission lines and their routes will be available at that time

The accompanying map depicts the two proposed sites it should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail this map should be used only as a percent grude. # CRITERIA USED TO REVIEW THE

CRITERIA USED TO REVIEW THE APPLICATION. The following legist criteria are set forth in Section 493-10 (A) of the Revised Copa and will be used, along with additional informa-tion, by the board in reviewing the applica-tion for a certificate to construct, operate and maintain the Biers Run Substation Project:

- . the basis of need for the facility in the case of a majority utility facility described in division (8x1) of Section 4965.01 of the Revised Code, the board shall presume the need for the facility as that need is stated in an application pursuant to division () of Section 4906 06 of the Revised Code
- the nature of the probable environmental impact of the proposed facility.
- the facility represents the minimum ad-

the state of available technology, the nature and economics of alternatives and other pertinent considerations.

- . in the case of electric transmission lines in the cash of electric transmission lines that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving Official and interconnected systems, and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability.
- the facility will comply with chapters 3704 3734 and 6111 of the Revised Code and al rules and standards adopted under sec-tions 1501.33, 1501.34 and 4561.32 of the Revised Code In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and stan dards adopted under Section 4561,34 of the Revised Code, the board shall consul with the office of aviation of the division of multi-moda, planning and programs of the Department of Transportation under Section 4361,341 of the Revised Code,
- the facility will comply with all arr and wa ter pollution control and so id waste dis posal laws and regulations.
- the facility will serve the public interest. the racinity will see the public incides; convenience and necessity. The facility's impact on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site of the proposed major utility facility, and
- . the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board considering available technology and the nature and economics of varour alternatives.

### Section 4906.07. Revised Code provides that

Upon the receipt of an application, complying with Section 4905 05 of the Revised Code, the power siting board shall promptly fix a date for a public hearing thereon instress than 60 or more than 90 days after such receipt and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditious ly as practicable

On the application for an amendment of a cer-On the application for an amendment of a cer-tificate the board shall hold a hearing in the same manner as a hearing is held for an appro-cation for a certificate if the proposed change in the facility would result in any material increase in any environmental impact of the facility or a substantial change in the location of all or a portion of such facility other than as provided in the alternates set forth in the application.

The chairman of the power siting board shall cause each application filled with the board to be investigated and shall not less than 15 days prior to the date any application is set follows: days prior to the date any application is set for hearing, subtin, a written report to the board and to the applicant. A copy of such report shall be made available to any person upon request. Such report shall set forth the nature of the investigation and shall contain recommended indings with regard to disknow (Assistant April Section 4305 till of the Revised Code and shall become part of the record and served upon all parties to the proceedings.
