ENTRY

The Commission finds:

- (1) On October 11, 2012, John W. Insco (complainant) filed a complaint against the respondent, Columbia Gas of Ohio, Inc. (Columbia) alleging, *inter alia*, that Columbia unreasonably turned off gas service to his home for safety reasons.
- (2) Columbia filed an answer generally denying the material allegations of the complaint on November 1, 2012.
- (3) By entry issued March 25, 2013, the city of Toledo was granted intervention in this matter.
- (4) On July 2, 2013, Columbia filed a motion to dismiss claiming that the complaint has been satisfied and, as a result, may be dismissed as a settled case under Rule 4901-9-01(F), Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.).
- (5) Rule 4901-9-01(F), O.A.C., provides that, if the public utility complained against files an answer or motion which asserts that the complaint has been satisfied and no response is filed within 20 days, the Commission may presume that satisfaction has occurred and dismiss the complaint.
- (6) The complainant has filed no response to Columbia's July 2, 2013, pleading asserting this complaint has been satisfied. The 20-day deadline for filing such a response has expired.
