Dad called police on airport shooting suspect's welfare

PENNSVILLE, N.J. (AP) — The young man believed to have carried out a shooting at Los Angeles International Airport had sent a sibling a text message mentioning suicide, leading their father to seek authorities' help in finding him, a New Jersey police chief said Friday.

Paul Ciancia's father called Pennsylvania Police Chief Allen Cummings early Friday afternoon saying another of his children had received a text message from the 23-year-old "in reference to him taking his own life," the chief said.

The elder Ciancia asked for help in locating Paul, Cummings said. The chief called Los Angeles police, which sent a patrol car to Ciancia's apartment. It wasn't clear whether the police visited before or after the airport shooting.

"Basically, there were two roommates there," Cummings said. "They said, 'We saw him yesterday and he was fine.'"

He told Ciancia's father that because of his son's age, he couldn't take a missing persons report.

A law enforcement official speaking on condition of anonymity identified Paul Ciancia as the man who pulled a semi-automatic rifle from a bag and shot his way past a security checkpoint at the airport, killing a security officer and wounding two other people.

The gunman was wounded in a shootout with police and was taken into custody, Los Angeles police said.

The official who identified Ciancia was briefed at the airport on the investigation

and requested anonymity because he was not authorized to speak publicly.

A motive wasn't immediately clear. The shooter was wearing fatigues and carrying a bag containing a handwritten note that said he "wanted to kill TSA and pigs," the official said.

A second law enforcement official confirmed the identity, speaking on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to discuss the investigation publicly.

The Pensacola police department has had no dealings with the younger Ciancia, Cummings said.

Neighbor Josh Pagan, 17, said that he would sometimes encounter Ciancia at orthodontist appointments, but that it had been at least two years since the last one.

"He was never weird toward me. He never gave me any weird vibes," he said.

Taliban leader killed by US drone

PESHAWAR, Pakistan (AP) — A U.S. drone strike Friday killed Hakimullah Mehsud, the leader of the Pakistani Taliban, in a major blow to the group that came after the government said it had started peace talks with the insurgents, according to intelligence officials and militant commanders.

Mehsud, who was on U.S. most-wanted terrorist lists with a \$5 million bounty, is believed to have been behind a deadly suicide attack at a CIA base in Afghanistan, a failed car bombing in New York's Times Square and other assaults in Pakistan that have killed thousands of civilians and security forces.

Kerry: Some spying went too far

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State John Kerry's remark that some National Security Agency surveillance "reached too far" was the first time a high-ranking Obama administration official acknowledged U.S. snooping abroad might be seen as overzealous.

After launching into a vigorous defense of surveillance as an effective counterterrorism tool, Kerry acknowledged to a video

conference on open government in London "in some cases, I acknowledge to you, as has the president, that some of these actions have reached too far, and we are going to make sure that does not happen in the future."

"There is no question that the president and I and others in government have actually learned of some things that had been happening, in many ways, on an automatic pilot because the technology is there," Kerry said, responding to a question about transparency in government.

Kerry was responding to questions from European allies about reports in the past two weeks that the National Security Agency had collected data on tens of millions of Europe-based phone calls and had monitored the cell phones of 35 world leaders, including that of German Chancellor Angela Merkel.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio and AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio Transco) propose to improve the transmission system in Seneca County by rebuilding the existing Tiffin Center Extension 138-kV line from the proposed Adelphi Station to the existing Tiffin Center Station.

The purpose of the project is to replace the existing single circuit H-frame structures with double circuit single steel poles. This project is part of AEP Ohio Transco's Frontiers Area Improvement Plan - a transmission reinforcement effort designed to help AEP maintain adequate transmission reliability in northwestern Ohio. Construction is scheduled to begin in March 2014.

The project is known as the Melmore-Tiffin Center 138-kV Line Improvement Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.11-01, AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board.

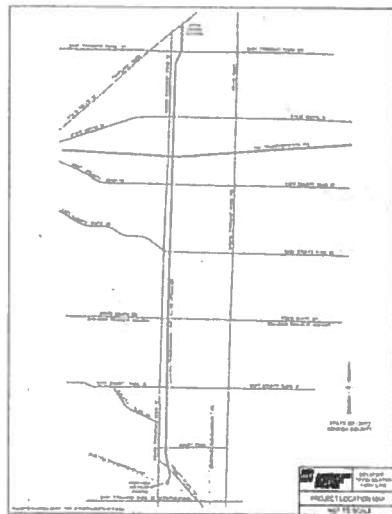
This project qualifies as a Letter of Notification (LON) because it meets the requirements outlined in OAC 4906.11-01, Item (4)(A) of Appendix A "Application Requirement Matrix for Electric Power Transmission Lines" for replacing electric power transmission line structures with a different type of structure within an existing electric power transmission line.

The Letter of Notification for the Melmore-Tiffin Center 138-kV Line Improvement Project is pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case Number 13-2003-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding.

Persons to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice required by Rule 4906-5-20(C)(1). OAC Petitioners should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite the above-listed case number.

The Melmore-Tiffin Center 138-kV Line Improvement Project involves the installation of 50 self-supporting single pole dead end structures and 43 self-supporting single pole dangle arm structures. New conductors, insulators and hardware will be installed on the new structures.

The project will be an approximate \$5 million investment by AEP in its transmission system in the area. The project will allow AEP to con-



tinue to provide the level of service its customers expect.

The accompanying map depicts the expansion size. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide.
