

My biggest artistic challenge

A few years ago, I did this color sketch of myself surrounded by my portrait collection. As this suggests, I don't take myself too seriously. Yet, since that time, I have learned more about me and what should have been included. It's great to see yourself from a different perspective.

I have spent most of my life creating art in both the commercial and fine arts world. I have had many artistic challenges but none more than capturing the faces of friends. I will never be what is known as a portrait artist. I quite honestly lack the skill and the training of a professional but this doesn't stop me from the challenge of capturing friends. In these specific paintings, I try to capture more than I see. I try to capture what I feel about them, a challenge that is past the normal visual likeness. Through color and brushstrokes, I try to capture the essence of the person. I

can't say that I am always successful but it's not because I am not trying. Maybe, it's because I try too hard and often overwork a portrait and in the process I lose the freshness, the spontaneity and maybe the real essence. I don't know.

People ask me when do I know a painting is done. If I am completely honest I will have to say I don't know. I have a distinct tendency to overwork, over-think, just over everything. Some paintings actually raise a red flag and say to me, I'm done, don't touch me again. Yes, sometimes I listen to them and they are right. I don't have all the art answers. I wish I did but maybe not, then I might stop exploring or even stop painting altogether and I am not ready for that yet.

I am passing into a new realm of painting and drawing faces. It came about through reading some very different books on face reading. The idea is that

most people have marks of certain facial features that hold the secrets of their personalities and how they perceive things, their point of view on life's many questions. This is an ancient art of face reading from China developed over 2,500 years ago.

This art or study is called Mien Shiang and I am exploring this study from an artist's perspective. I cannot say if this study is correct or not in its realm but from my perspective it has helped me to become more aware of facial features than I ever experienced before. I am presently incorporating this realm of ideas into my face and head drawing and painting classes. Becoming more aware of a person's features is always a good thing if the premise of this study has any relevance.

What I am saying is that I have added an entire new realm of understanding or perception to what I had

before and I am seeing more and I am learning more from what I see.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

American Transmission Systems, Incorporated (Applicant), a FirstEnergy Company, has filed an application with the Ohio Power Siting Board (Board) in Case No. 13-2112-EL-BTA seeking to amend its certificate of environmental compatibility and public need issued to construct the East Springfield-London-Tangy 138 kV Transmission Line Project in Clark, Delaware, Madison and Union counties, Ohio, approved by the Board in Case Number 11-4884-EL-BTX. The purpose of the Amendment is to adjust the approved route to reflect seven changes. Four changes were requested by property owners. Three changes are requested by the Applicant to avoid impacts to high quality wetlands, avoid stormwater ponds, and accommodate substation engineering design. The adjustments are generally located in the following areas: North and South of U.S. 40 in Clark County, South of State Route 29, Northeast and Southwest of Mitchell Dewart Road in Union County, West and East of Bell Road in Union County, South of U.S. Highway 42 North in Union County, Northeast and Southwest of Mills Road in Delaware County, and near the Tangy Substation off Bunty Station Road in Delaware County. The Applicant believes the adjustments to the approved route can be reasonably accommodated without significant increased impacts and have therefore proposed the adjustments in the Amendment. In the event one or more of the proposed adjustments are not approved by the Board, the Applicant intends to proceed with constructing that portion of the project on the route previously approved by the Board. A copy of the Amendment application is available at the Board's main office at 180 East Broad Street, 11th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Copies of the Amendment Application have been provided to the Clark County Public Library; Delaware Main Library; Hurst/Battelle Memorial Library; London Public Library; Plain City Public Library; and Marysville Public Library. Interested persons wishing to comment on or raise objections to the proposed Amendment may do so by filing written comments and, if desired, a request for a hearing, specifically referencing Case No. 13-2112-EL-BTA, with the Board within 10 days of the publication of this notice.
