Af P Ohio a unit of American Electric Power (AEP), and the AEP Ohio Transmission Company, propose to construct a new high voltage 138-kilovoli (kV) transmission substation in Hancock County

The project is known as the known as the Findlay Area Improvement Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906, AEP Ohio seeks a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need from the state of Ohio Power Sitting Board


The Findlay Area Improvement Project is a ma-The Findlay Area Improvement Project is a ma-jor transmission reinforcement offort to help AFP accommodate development and trainitian an adequate lovel of transmission reliability in northwestim. Ohio and Hancock County. The proposed station will allow the company to address reliability concerns about potential low voltages during certain conditions. With-out this substation, in a worst case scenario, uncontrolled widespread power outages may affect major portions of Hancock and nearby counties.

AEP proposes to huild Ebersole Station on approximately 57 acros in Cass Township in Hancuk County, approximately 17 miles northeast of Findley. The property is near the intersection of Iownship Raped 238 and County Road 216 The completed station will use approximately four acres with between one-half to one acre dedicated to an access drive.

The project also will make improvements at several existing substations and upgrade existing 138-kV transmission lines along existing rights of way This includes replacing and upgrading several existing towers and structures

This improvement work will resolve low voltage concorns discovered during PJM's Regional Transmission Expansion Plan studies. These al Ius smission Expansion Plan studios. The existing transmission system in the area includes the Fostona Central and East Lima



345/138-kV lines in addition, there are 139-kV interconnections with First Energy at West Fremont Station and Howard Stations, and 69-kV and 34-5-kV lower voltage transmission loops around the Findlay area that feed AEP Olivo's distribution system.

AFP will invest an estimated \$11.2 million in the Ebersola Station project. The station is expected to provide approximately \$436.310 in property taxes to local schools and communities.

The accompanying map depicts the two proposed sites it should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide. CRITERIA USED TO REVIEW THE APPLI-CATION

The following eight criteria are set forth in Section 4906 10 (A) of the Ravised Code and will be used along with additional information, by the board in reviewing the application for a certificate to construct, operate and maintain the Ebersole Station Project

- the nature of the probable environmental impact of the proposed facility,
- the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering

the state of available technology, the na ture and economics of alternatives and other pertinent considerations,

- oner perment considerations, in the case of electric transmission lines, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving Ohio and interconnected systems and that the facility will serve the interests or electric systems expony and walkabits. system economy and reliability

Section 4906 07, Revised Code provides that:

Upon the inceipt of an application, complying with Section 4906 00 of the Revised Carte, the power sting board shall promptly fix a date for a public heuring thereon not less than 60 or more than 90 days after such inceipt and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditiously as practicable. practicable

On the application for an aniendment of a cer-tificate, the board shall hold a licaring in the same manuar as a houring is held for an appli-cation for a certificate if the proposed change in the facility would result in any material increase in any environmental inspect of the facility or a substantial change in the location of all or a portion of such facility other than as provided in the alternates set forth in the asplication.

The chairman of the power siting board shall cause each application filled with the board to be investigated and shall, not loss than 15 days prior to the date any application is set for hearing, submit a written report to the board and to the applicant A copy of such report shall be made available to any person upon request. Such report shall set forth the nature of the investigation and shall contain recommended findings with repart to division [A] of Section 4906 10 of the Review!
