The purpose of the project is to relocate the existing steel lattice towers to accommodate the expansion of the Gavin Coal Combustion Resource Landfill. The relocated line will be approximately 1.3 miles in length. Construction is scheduled to begin in February 2014. The transmission line project is located entirely on

The project is known as the Gawn 138-kV Ex-tension No 2 Relocation Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4506-11-01, AEP Ohio has filed a Letter of Notification with the state of Ohio Power Siting Board.


