INTERSTATE GAS SUPPLY INC.'S MEMORANDUM CONTRA APPLICATIONS FOR REHEARING

On December 18, 2013, the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("Commission") set forth a Finding and Order in the above-captioned proceeding amending the rules that pertain to competitive retail electric service ("CRES") in Ohio. On January 17, 2014, Interstate Gas Supply, Inc. ("IGS") filed an Application for Rehearing in this proceeding. In furtherance of the Commission's policy of limiting duplicative arguments that are already made by other parties in this proceeding, IGS notes its endorsement of the following positions in RESA's Memorandum Contra filed in this proceeding:

- Rule 21-05(A): CRES providers should not have to disclose in their marketing materials or a service contract for residential and small commercial customers, how a proposed variable rate would have performed over the past 12-24 months, or the index/formula for the variable rate.
- Rule 21-05(B): CRES marketing materials should not be required to be provided to OCC whenever requested by the Commission, Staff or OCC.
- Rule 21-11(F): Affirmative customer consent should not be required for any CRES contract with material changes to renew.
- Rule 21-18(D)(3): CRES-consolidated bills should not have to include the total annual electric costs.
- Publication of customer complaints: The Commission made no error in not establishing by rule a format for the public to review CRES complaint information held by the Commission.
