NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio Transmission Company (AEP Ohio Transco) has proposed to improve the transmission system near Leesville, Ohio, by installing a new 138-kilovolt transmission line in Orange Township in Carroll County.

The purpose of the project is to provide electric service to Urica East Ohio Midstream LLC (Midstream) gas processing facility. The project will be constructed to 138-kV standards for future load growth in the area; however, the line initially will be energized for 69-kV service. Construction is scheduled to begin in March 2014 with tree clearing, followed by transmission line work in April 2014.

The project is known as the Azalea 138-kV Extension East. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.11-01, AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board, under Case No. 14-0195-EL-BLN.

This project meets the requirements for a Letter of Notification because it is within the types of projects defined by Items (1)(f) of Attachment A of the interim process defined in the OPSB's September 4, 2012 Finding and Order in Docket 12-1991-GE-BRD. This states that a project qualifies for a Letter of Notification if the project is:


- (1) An electric transmission line that is:
(f) Primarily needed to attract or meet the requirements of a specific customer or customers

The Letter of Notification for the Azalea 138-kV Extension East is pending before the Ohio Power Siting Board. This application has been assigned Case No. 14-0195-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this proceeding.

Petitions to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of its notice required by Rule 4906-3-08(E)(1), OAC. Petitions should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite Case No. 14-0195-EL-BLN.

The Azalea 138-kV Extension East Project involves the construction of 20 new alternating braced post steel pole structures. New conductor, insulators and hardware will be installed on the structures.

The project will be an approximate \$2.4 million investment by AEP in its transmission system



in the area. The project will allow AEP to continue to provide the level of service its customers expect.

The accompanying map depicts the project area. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be used only as a general guide.
