# Study planned on changing Great Lakes levels

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — Great Lakes levels will continue rising and falling — often unpredictable ways — and people should learn to deal with the changes instead of trying to tame nature with costly engineering projects, experts said Thursday.

Donald Scavin, director of

Graham Sustainability Institute, announced a wide-ranging study of ways to adapt to upand-down water levels during a seminar at which about 50 Great Lakes policymakers, settlets and adverted forts to control the bodies of water would be worth the trouble.

"Lake levels are varying and they're going to continue to arry," Seavia said.




