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## NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

American Transmission Systems, Incorporated (ATSI), a FirstEnergy company, has proposed to construct the Hayes-West Fremont 138 kV Transmission Line Project, a new major utility facility, in an Application submitted to the Ohio Pow Sting Board for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need The proposed Preferred and Alternate Routes for the Hayes-West Fremont 138 kV Transmission Line Project involve approximately 30 miles of new 138 kV transmission line construction that will extend from the Haves Substatic (currently under construction) to the existing West Fremont Substation in a new transmission line comptor. The Preferred transmission line route is located in Sandusky, Riley, Townsend and York Townships in Sandusky County, Ohio and Groton, Oxford, and Perkins Townships in Eric County, Ohio. The Atternate transmission line route is located in Sandusky, Riley, Green Creek, Townsend and York Townships and the City of Fremont in Sandusky County, Ohio and Groton, Margaretta, and Perkins Townships in Erie County, Ohio. Specific detailed information on the proposed project is included in the Application. The general location of the Preferred and Alternate routes for the transmission line. are shown on the accompanying map of the area.

An application for a certificate to construct, operate, and maintain the Hayes West Fremont 138 kV Transmission Line Project is now pending before the Ohio Power Siling Board. This application has been assigned Docket No 12-1636-EL-BTX, which should be referenced in all communications about accordance with the Ohio Power Siting Board regulations (Admin. Code lule 4906-5-08), the following sections of the Ohio Revised Code plus

### Section 4906.10(A)

(A) The power siting board shall render a decision upon the record either granking or denying the application as filed, or granting it upon such terms, conditions, or modifications of the construction, operation, or maintenance of the major utility facility as the board considers appropriate. The certific shall be conditioned upon the facility being in compliance with standards and rules adopted under sections 1501.33, 1501.34, and 4881.32 and Chapters 3704., 3734., and 6111. of the Revised Code. The period of initial operation under a certificate shall expire two years after the date on which electric power is this generated by the facility. During the period of initial operation, the facility shall be subject to the enforcement and monitoring powers of the director of environmental protection under Chapters 3704, 3734, and 6111. of the Revised Code and to the emergency provisions under those chapters. If a major utility facility constructed in accordance with the terms and conditions of its certificate is unable to operate in compliance with all applicable requirements of state laws, rules, and standards perfaining to air pollution, the facility may apply to the director of environmental protection for a conditional operating permit under division (G) of section 3704 G3 of the Revised Code and the rules adopted there under. The operation of a major utility facility in compliance with a conditional operating permit is not in violation of its certificate. After the expiration of the period of initial operation of a major utility facility, the facility shall be under the jurisdiction of the environmental protection agency and shall comply with all laws, rules, and standards pertaining to air pollution, water pollution, and solid and hazardous waste disposal.

The board shall not grant a certificate for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a major utility facility, either as proposed or as modified by the board, unless it finds and determines all of the following:

(1) The basis of the need for the facility if the facility is an electric transmission line or gas or natural gas trans

(2) The nature of the probable environmental impact.

(3) That the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact. nsidering the state of available technology and the nature and economics of the various alternatives, and other pertinent considerations

(4) In the case of an electric transmission line or generating facility, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving this state and interconnected utility systems and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability.

(5) That the facility will comply with Chapters 3704., 3734., and 6111. of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under those chapters and under sections 1501 33, 1501.34, and 4561,32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopt under section 456.32 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-modal planning and programs of the department of transportation under section 4581,341 of the Revised Code.

(6) That the facility will serve the public interest, conve (7) In addition to the provisions contained in divisions (A)(1) to (6) of this section and rules adopted under those divisions, what its impact will be on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929, of the Flevised Code that is located within the site and alternative site of the proposed major utility facility. Rules adopted to evaluate impact under division (A)(7) of this section shall not require the compilation, creation, submission, or production of any information, docume or other data pertaining to land not located within the site and alternative site (8) That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board, considering available technology and

ction 4906.07. Public hearing on application

(A) Upon the receipt of an application complying with section 4906.06 of the Revised Code, the power string board shall promptly fix a date for a public heering thereon, not less than sixty nor more than ninety days after such receipt, and shall conclude the proceeding as expeditiously as practicable

(B) On an application for an amendment of a certificate, the board shall hold a hearing in the same manner as a hearing is held on an application for a certificate if the proposed change in the facility would result in any material se in any environmental impact of the facility or a substantial change in the location of all or a portion of such lacility other than as provided in the alternates set forth in the application.

(C) The charmen of the power siting board shall cause each application filed ith the board to be investigated and shall, not less than lifteen days prior to the date any application is set for hearing submit a written report to the board and to the applicant. A copy of such report shall be made available to any person upon request. Such report shall set forth the nature of the investigation, and shall contain recommended findings with regard to divi (A) of section 4906.10 of the Revised Code and shall become part of the record and served upon all parties to the proceeding.
