



The purpose of the Sporn-Muskingum River 345-kV Transmission Line Rebuild Project is to aggrade two 245-kV circuits using existing right of way between Muslangum River Station in Ohio and Waterford Station in Ohio and Muskingum River Station in Ohio and Sporn Station in West Virginia. The project will treverse through Docatur, Feirfield, Polmer, Waterlord and Watertown townships in Washrigton County as well as Carthage, Rome and Troy townships in Athens County, Chester, Le-tart, Orange and Sutton townships in Meigs County, Windsor Township in Morgan County, and Mason County in West Virginia. The proj ect is approximately 50 miles in length. 
