NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AFP Ohio Transmission Company (AFP Ohio Transco) proposes to construct a new 138-kV (kV) transmission line in Lee Township in Carroll County.

The purpose of the Panda Road 138-kV Transmission Line Extension Project is to provide electricity to Access Midstream's gas facility. AFP Ohio Transco will build the new line using approximately five standard single-pole 138-kV structures. The Panda Road 138-kV transmission line will be about one-fourth mile long. This project will be an approximate \$1 million investment by AFP Ohio Transco. Construction is anticipated to begin in August 2014.

The project is known as the Panda Road 138-kV Transmission Line Extension Project. As required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4906.11-01, AFP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board, under Case No. 14-1120-EL-BNR. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this project.

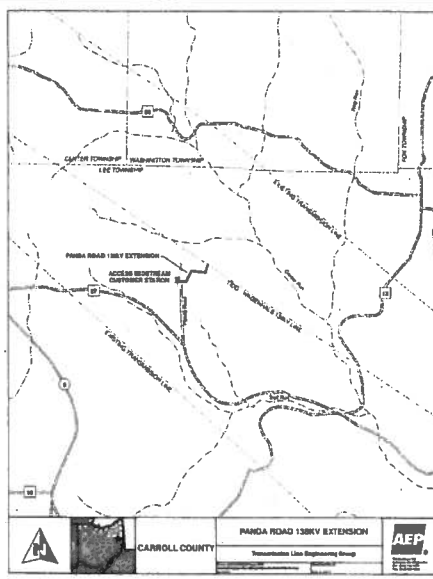
This project meets the requirements for a Letter of Notification because it is within the types of projects defined by Items (1)(9) and (1)(10) of Attachment A of the interim process defined in the OPSB's Sept. 4, 2012, Finding and Order in Docket 12-1901-GE-BNO. This states that a project qualifies for a Letter of Notification if the project is:

- (1) Relocating, extension or new construction of single or multiple circuit electric transmission line(s);
- (d) One hundred twenty-five kV and above, but less than three hundred kV, and greater than 0.2 miles in length but not greater than two miles in length.

- (1) Relocating, extension or new construction of single or multiple circuit electric transmission line(s);
- (f) Primarily needed to meet the requirements of a specific customer or customers.

Persons to intervene in or comment on the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice required by Rule 4906-5-08(C)(1), DAC. Petitions should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite Case No. 14-1120-EL-BNR.

The accompanying map depicts the project area. It should be noted that due to the reduced scale and limited detail, this map should be

CRITERIA USED TO REVIEW THE APPLICATION

The following eight criteria are set forth in Section 4906.10(A) of the Revised Code and will be used, along with additional information, by the board in reviewing the application for a certificate to construct, operate and maintain the Panda Road 138-kV transmission line:

- The basis of need for the facility,
- The nature of the probable environmental impact of the proposed facility,
- The facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact, considering the state of available technology, the nature and economics of alternatives and other pertinent considerations.

- In the case of electric transmission lines, that the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid of the electric systems serving Ohio and interconnected systems, and that the facility will serve the interests of electric system economy and reliability.
- The facility will comply with chapters 3704, 3734 and 611 of the Revised Code and all rules and standards adopted under sections 1501.33, 1501.34 and 4561.32 of the Revised Code. In determining whether the facility will comply with all rules and standards adopted under Section 4561.34 of the Revised Code, the board shall consult with the office of aviation of the division of multi-modal planning and programs of the Department of Transportation under Section 4361.341 of the Revised Code;
- The facility will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity;
- The facility's impact on the viability as agricultural land of any land in an existing agricultural district established under Chapter 929 of the Revised Code that is located within the site of the proposed major utility facility; and
- The facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices as determined by the board considering available technology and the nature and economics of various alternatives.
