## **ENTRY**

The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) On May 30, 2014, the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA) filed a notice of intent (NOI) to file an application to adjust the Universal Service Fund riders of all Ohio jurisdictional electric distribution utilities.
- (2) Pursuant to the procedural entry issued June 20, 2014, motions to intervene and objections or comments to ODSA's NOI were due by July 11, 2014, and replies to any objections or comments filed were due by July 18, 2014. No objections or comments to the NOI were filed. The hearing is scheduled for August 27, 2014.
- (3) On June 20, 2014, Industrial Energy Users-Ohio (IEU) filed a motion to intervene. IEU asserts, as an association of energy-intensive Ohio manufacturers, it has a real and substantial interest that is not represented by another party to this matter. Further, IEU contends the disposition of this case may impair or impede its ability to protect that interest. No memorandum contra IEU's motion for intervention was filed.
- (4) The attorney examiner finds that IEU has a real and substantial interest in this case and, therefore, the motion to intervene should be granted.
