Duke Energy has filed an Electronic Security Plan (ESP) requesting a Price Stabilization Rider to hedge benefits of the costs associated with Duke Energy's contractual obligation to the Ohio Valley Electric Corporation (OVEC). Duke proposes to sell its portion of energy and associated services into the competitive market to maintain the integrity of the fully competitive auction process. This rider is a new charge to benefit certain power plants. Ohio law states that utility charges to customers for power plants is to be competitively determined by the electricity market and not guaranteed by PUCO, the government regulator.

The Kyger Creek Power Plant in now abandoned Cheshire Ohio, is part of the OVEC and uses dirty coal to generate electricity then produces nasty water and filthy air that violates the Federal Clean Air and Water laws. Since the Kyger Creek Power Plant does NOT meet Federal Clean Air and Water laws, like any company, it must be shutdown till the owner either improves (at its own cost, NOT paid by the customers) it so it operates within the law or decommissions it (also paid by the company not the customers).

Any power plant (as well as facilities & citizens) must operate within the law and be able to sell its energy on the open market with no rider that only benefits certain plants. Anything else is power plant welfare and is a bailout for dirty power plants that violate the law.
