We would like to take this opportunity to urge your support of FirstEnergy's proposed Electric Security Plan, *Powering Ohio's Progress*. There are many reasons why we support ete FirstEnergy's plan:

accurate locument technici brownouts as it appeared the grid manager PJM would be utilizing them because the grid was overstressed! As a rural county, dealing with rolling brownouts at any time of the year is very challenging, but dealing with them during such severe winter conditions would be even worse. The fact of the matter is that rolling brownouts, and worse yet, extended blackouts, would pose a significant threat to the safety and well-being of the public.

We also believe the plan contributes to stabilizing the price of electricity during the deregulation process and subsequent time period which has experienced market volatility. Electric rates have continued at considerable lows for about 5 years due to the decreased demand of a slowing economy and increase in natural gas generation of electricity among other market factors. Also, significant electric generation is being taken off line because of increased regulation mandates. At some point the market will react if not over react to the significant loss in reliable local electric generation by significant price increases for years to come, because the construction of electric generation plants demands large amounts of capital and time to get up and running. This plan along with other base load preservation can help prevent an extended period of time of intense inflation of electric rates in Ohio. The reliable supply of affordable electric not only impacts the safety and wellbeing of our residents but it also is crucial for our business community, especially the manufacturing industry in Ohio. Ottawa County, the region and the State all work to retain, develop and attract businesses. A reliable supply of affordable electric is an absolute necessity for business to be competitive.

There are a number of additional reasons to support FirstEnergy's plan. Those include jobs, economic benefits, and environmental reasons that not only greatly affect Ottawa County, the region and the State of Ohio. All of these are of great import and therefore we request your support.
