To the Commissioners of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio:

PUCO

On behalf of the Franklin County Workers Benefit Council a delegate body of low-paid service, part-time, temporary and other workers throughout central Ohio, we are presenting you with the attached petitions.

The Workers Benefit Council calls upon Public Utilities Commission of Ohio to carry out your mission statement, "to provide fair, adequate and safe access to utilities for all Ohioans." Yet according to *The Columbus Dispatch* Columbia Gas sent out over 20,000 disconnection notices as of September with an additional 12,000 who had already been shut-off in the central Ohio area. In one year, the Ohio Consumer Council reported that you allowed AEP to shut-off 72,000 households in the state. These policies have real consequences: families made homeless, facing fires due to unsafe heating. This is while PUCO allowed AEP rate hikes resulting in record profits, most recently of \$2.5 billion. 160,000 families in Franklin County alone can't afford their utilities. PUCO must represent the ratepayers, not just protecting monopoly utility companies' profits.

*As stated in our petition and signed by over 1600 Ohio ratepayers, we demand that you:*

1. Lower utility rates for residential customers and small business owners, such that their utility service is "adequate, safe and reliable."
2. Establish a year-round moratorium on gas and electric utility shut-offs for Ohio residents whose income is at or below 300% of the federal poverty line.
3. Direct AEP and Columbia Gas to cancel arrears for their customers whose incomes are at or below 300% of the federal poverty line.
4. Allow anyone whose service has been terminated because of economic inability to pay due to hardships such as ill health, job loss or foreclosure to renegotiate a reasonable and affordable payment plan based on their incomes, and have their services reconnected forthwith, without penalty fees.

We ask that you present our demands to PUCO at your next meeting or sooner if the meeting is a more than a month away and respond to us in writing about how you will carry out these demands.
