Ohio's power plants create thousands of jobs through ongoing maintenance, repair, and improvement projects that put our members to work.

Although we are excited about and working towards a more diverse mix of sources for our energy future we know it will take a lot of work to get there. In the meantime we are greatly concerned how many power plants in Ohio have been permanently mothballed in recent years. Further decline in Ohio's electric power generation capacity will cost thousands of good paying jobs and discourage industrial development opportunities across the state.

Consistent with our interest in creating construction job opportunities, we're urging your support of FirstEnergy's proposed Electric Security Plan, *Powering Ohio's Progress*. FirstEnergy's plan strikes the right balance between keeping electricity affordable for customers while helping to ensure the continued operation of Ohio power plants, our very own Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Plant in Oak Harbor, the W.H.
