
I recently moved to Ohio from the great city of Chicago, all to learn that Ohio has some of the most polluted air in all of the United States. This is very troubling.


Dear Sirs,

My name is Ella Ustin, and I live in Shaker Heights, near Cleveland. As a 13-year-old in 7th grade, I am not the one in my family to purchase coal, but this issue is especially pertinent to me because I care greatly about the environment, and will soon be a citizen whom this issue will affect.

My family has—and will continue to—take many steps to limit our toll on the environment. We had insulation installed in our walls to lessen the amount of heat we have to generate in the winter. We produce 90% of our electricity through solar panels on our roof. We strive to produce minimal waste, recycle, compost, and grow much of our food organically in our garden. Please don't make us pay to hurt the environment, which we work so hard to preserve.

Instead, you should temporarily approve the tax raise, but instead put that money toward updating and improving these plants, which, like any old machine, will inevitably need to be replaced. Also, if you go ahead with this plan, when the time comes to upgrade the plant, you will have no means of raising that money. FirstEnergy, Duke, and AEPs' proposal benefits no one in the long run.

I was told to make this letter as personal as possible, and I understand. It can be hard to see that your decision will affect EVERYONE, even a random middle-schooler in Cleveland. 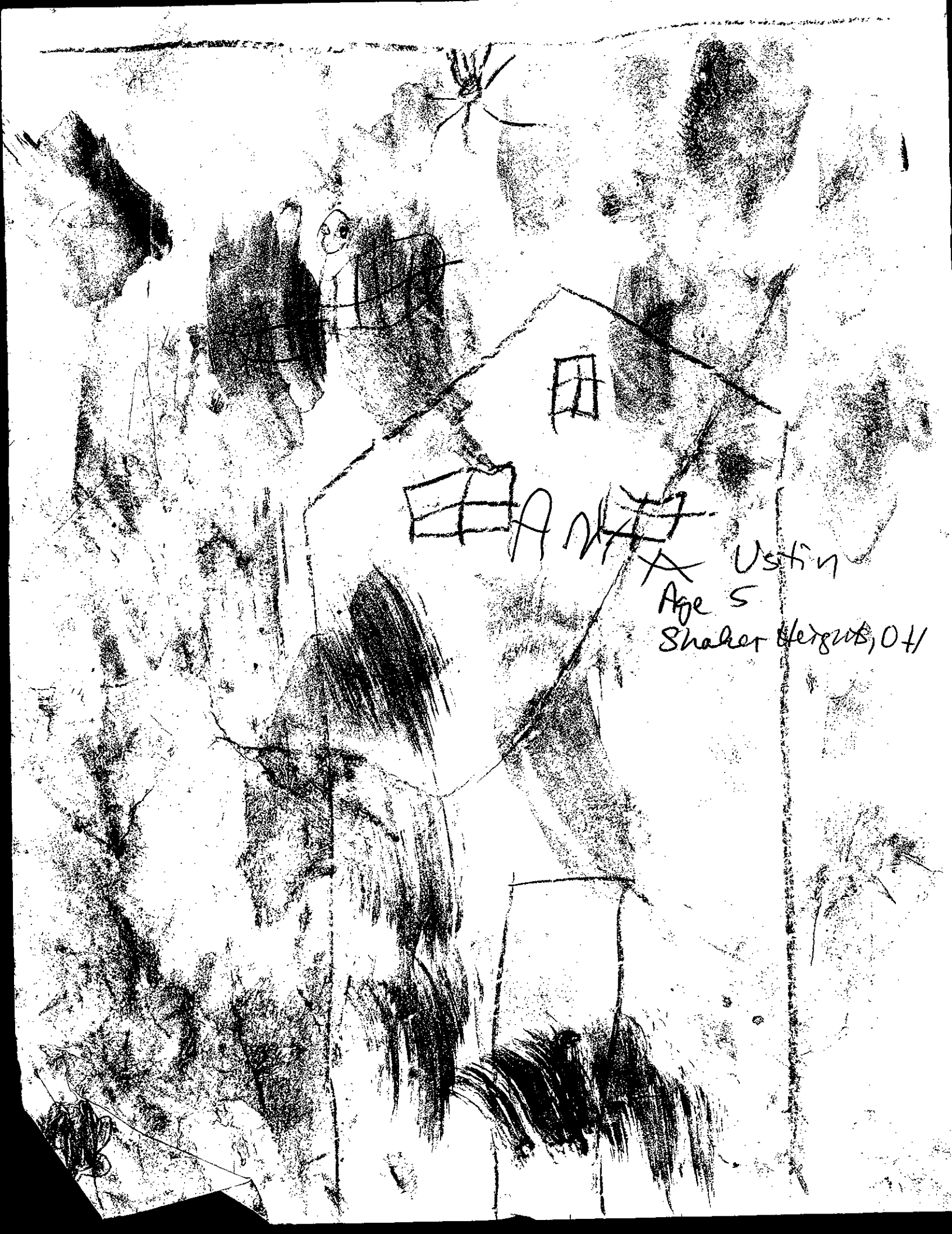

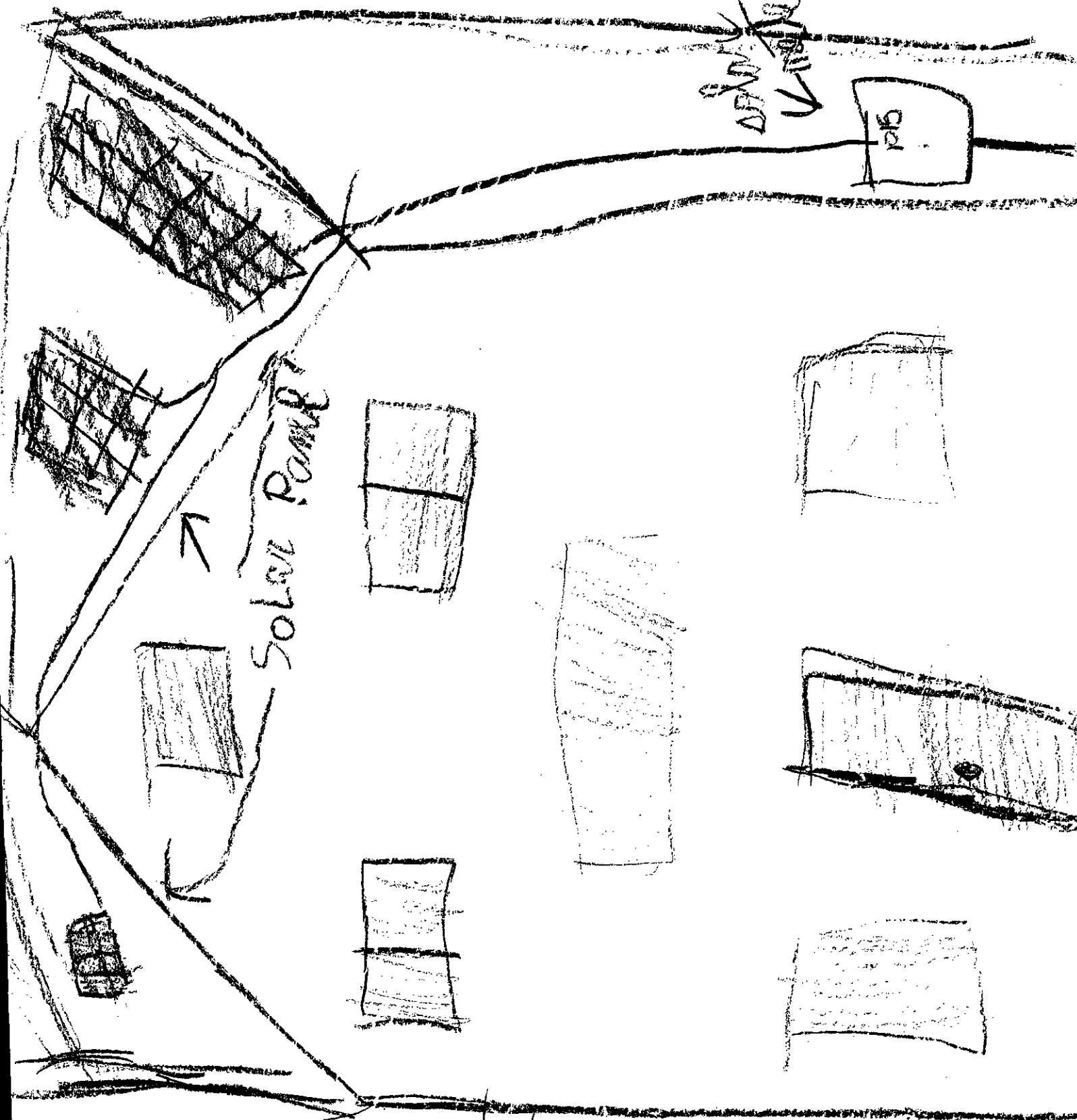

Dear PUCO Commissioners:

Volunteers from Ohio Citizen Action knocked on my door tonight to raise my awareness of this proposed "bailout of outdated coal plants" - and despite the fact that I have a kid home with pink eye and perhaps because I have a husband who should have had an endoscopy this morning except for the Cleveland Clinic LOSING POWER at its main campus Crile Building, and an aging mother with chronic asthmatic coughing here in Ohio- I stopped to listen to their case. It interested me enough to go to their website, which I quote from here:


"Duke Energy, AEP, and First Energy teamed up to file proposals with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) to get permission to raise consumer rates and use the profits to cover the costs of their outdated and inefficient coal plants. These energy companies want to shift the cost of these outdated coal plants to consumers because they are no longer competitive in the free market.

If the PUCO approves their plans, ratepayers would be forced to pay the utilities specifically for the power from these coal-fired power plants. FirstEnergy has an additional coal plant and a nuclear plant they've added that are not jointly owned."

Now I confess that I don't know what all the alternatives are, and how fast clean alternative energies can be put into place, and what the associated costs are and how that is going to effect me, my community and the environment, but I would respectfully ask that those questions be answered before yet another cost is passed onto consumers like me (to support outdated coal plants no less) who are often too busy with kids with pink eye, colds, parents with chronic coughing etc., to make the time to look into these issues.

I appreciate Ohio Citizen Action bringing this issue to my attention and now that it is on my radar screen I will be reviewing PUCO's actions in the case with interest. It seems to me the right thing would be to deny the proposed rate increase and prevent these power companies from forcing consumers to pay for inefficient coal plants when alternatives are possible and preferable.
