The attorney examiner finds:

- (1) On December 22, 2014, Chasity Lambert (Complainant) filed a complaint against Ohio Power Company (AEP-Ohio). The Complainant alleges that AEP-Ohio back billed her to make up for a faulty electric meter that remained in service for six months. The billings attached to her complaint show that \$48.20 was due on October 28, 2014. The next bill shows \$832.64 due eight days later for rebilled charges. AEP-Ohio has threatened disconnection of service for nonpayment. The Complainant wants AEP-Ohio to take responsibility for the damaged meter and to cease collection efforts.
- (2) AEP-Ohio filed an answer to the complaint on January 8, 2015. AEP-Ohio denied all allegations and moved to dismiss the complaint.
- (3) At this time, the attorney examiner finds that this matter should be scheduled for a settlement conference. The purpose of the conference will be to explore the parties' willingness to negotiate a resolution of this complaint in lieu of an evidentiary hearing. In accordance with Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-26, any statement made in an attempt to settle this matter without the need for an evidentiary hearing will not generally be admissible in future proceedings in this case or be admissible to prove liability or invalidity of a claim. Nothing prohibits any party from initiating settlement negotiations prior to the scheduled settlement conference. An attorney examiner with

the Commission's Legal Department will facilitate the settlement process.

- (4) Accordingly, a settlement conference shall be scheduled for March 3, 2015, at 10:00 a.m., in Room 1246, at the offices of the Commission, 12th Floor, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. If a settlement is not reached at the conference, the attorney examiner may conduct a discussion of procedural issues. Procedural issues for discussion may include discovery dates, possible stipulations of facts, and potential hearing dates.
- (5) Pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901-1-26(F), the representatives of the Respondent shall investigate the issues raised in the complaint prior to the settlement conference, and all parties participating in the conference shall be prepared to discuss settlement of the issues raised and shall have the requisite authority to settle those issues. In addition, parties participating in the settlement conference should have with them all documents relevant to this matter.
- (6) As is the case in all Commission complaint proceedings, the complainant has the burden of proving the allegations of the complaint. *Grossman v. Public. Util. Comm.*, 5 Ohio St.2d 189, 214 N.E.2d 666 (1966).

It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That a settlement conference be held on March 3, 2015, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 1246 in the offices of the Commission, 12th Floor, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties and interested persons of record.
