I am concerned about FirstEnergy's proposal to eliminate 85 percent of its energy efficiency programs, which are creating jobs and saving its customers hundreds of millions of dollars. In addition, as I understand it, FirstEnergy is asking permission to force its customers to guarantee revenues to its 55-year old Sammis coal plant in Stratton, Ohio, through 2031.

The Sammis coal-burning power plant is a source of carbon dioxide emissions in the entire country and is also a major source of toxic air pollutants such as sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides, contributing to serious health issues like asthma and lung disease. I worry that I, my family and my grandchildren will pay a respiratory price for this decision.

I and thousands of electric customers have already opposed FirstEnergy's requests. Similarly requests by American Electric Power and Duke have also drawn criticism from some of Ohio's largest employers like Macy's, Lowe's, and Staples as well as the PUCO Staff because bailing out uneconomic coal plants will increase business costs and interfere with the competitive free market.⁶ If these costs are approved, those employers may be required to cut jobs to pay for rising electric bills.



Governor Kasich,

I'm writing to voice my opposition to the approval of the proposed Purchase Power Agreement (case no. 14-1297-EL-SSO). The foremost reason is that the companies in question, First Energy, AEP, and Duke Energy, have repeatedly refused to disclose critical information required for independent assessment of the short- or long-term economic viability of the plan. No sane investor would commit his money to a business venture without being able to perform his or her due diligence, and the Ohio taxpayers should be no exception. In fact, the desire not to release business data to the public should be one of the main considerations preventing businesses from seeking government assistance.

More to the point, the idea that these companies should require taxpayer assistance to ensure the financial viability of these plants is, frankly, ridiculous. These organizations, made up of legions of blue and white collar workers, and representing collective centuries of energy industry experience, have ample ability to assess long term costs for plant maintenance, raw materials, and other expenses, which, while subject to some variability on a year-to-year basis, are eminently predictable on a medium term basis. In other words, these companies have had ample time to expand their use of other means of power generation, whether through wind, solar, natural gas, or nuclear plants. The only assumption is that deliberate choices were made to favor short term gains over long term profitability. This is the sort of behavior that a free market punishes, and rightly so. If Ohio is committed to developing a competitive energy marketplace, then protecting incumbents with callous, short-sighted leadership is antithetical to our goals.

Lastly, I generally view the idea that companies can hold their own employees hostage in exchange for government largesse to be effectively the same as extortion. Even if the ethics of the situation are ignored, the jobs these organizations are threatening to eliminate are specialized roles in an industry where skills are still largely learned at work. As the fraction of the population seeking college diplomas increases, the number of people in the workforce entering high-skill blue collar jobs is dwindling. As the previous generation edges towards retirement, these jobs are in increasing demand, as any manufacturer in the state will plainly tell you. If these companies release a large number of these skilled workers into the job market, the only result will be reduced labor costs for their competition, making Ohio even more attractive for new energy investment from more capably managed organizations.
