The attorney examiner finds:

- Ohio Power Company d/b/a AEP Ohio (AEP Ohio) is a public utility as defined by R.C. 4905.02, and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.
- (2) On May 19, 2014, the Commission final filed with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR) an amended rule in Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-10-05, with an effective date of May 29, 2014, that required electric utilities to file proposed advanced meter opt-out service tariffs.
- (3) On June 27, 2014, AEP Ohio filed an application in this case for approval of its proposed advanced meter opt-out service tariffs.
- (4) Gov.Bar R. XII(2)(A) provides rules governing eligibility to practice pro hac vice in Ohio. Pursuant to Gov.Bar R. XII(2)(A)(6), motions for pro hac vice must be accompanied by a certificate of pro hac vice registration furnished by the Supreme Court Office of Attorney Services.
- (5) On April 28, 2015, a motion to appear pro hac vice and certificate of pro hac vice registration were filed for Matthew S. McKenzie on behalf of AEP Ohio.
- (6) The attorney examiner finds that the motion to appear pro hac vice filed on April 28, 2015, is reasonable and should be granted.

ORDERED, That the motion to appear pro hac vice filed on behalf of Matthew S. McKenzie be granted. It is, further,
