Dear Mr. Porter,

I am writing you of my concerns regarding the potential bailout of the energy industry here in Ohio. As a consumer I am most interested in a couple of key items. First, I am concerned that, in this day and age, we in Ohio continue to rely on outmoded and dirty technology to meet our energy needs. Second, as a father with a child at Ohio State and a homeowner, I care about reducing both toxic pollution and the cost of my electric bills.

I understand that, across the country, utilities are looking for a public bailout. This is frankly unconscionable and just plain unethical. Public utilities should be stewards of the environment and should be constantly seeking more sustainable ways of producing energy. Also unacceptable is their position that their consumers should bear the brunt of their reluctance to invest in clean energy options.

I stand firm that any rate increase that would lock consumers into buying power from outmoded and dirty plants is just plain wrong. I also feel very strongly that a public bailout of old, polluting technology benefits utility shareholders rather than the public at large. The Governor is elected to represent the public's interests rather than stockholders of any particular private entity. While I realize that the Commission is appointed by the Governor, I will closely monitor Mr. Kasich's and your position with an eye towards upcoming elections.

As individuals we need to make prudent investments. While these may hurt in the short-term, our analysis indicates that they are prudent in the long term. As an individual making these investments, I do not expect anyone, whether private or governmental, to subsidize what I believe to be the correct plan of action. Utilities should have a similar stance. A bailout of outdated, polluting technology will delay the inevitable necessary investment in efficient and renewable energy.

I realize that this is a difficult issue but respectfully request that you and the Ohio PUC carefully consider the facts at hand and make the right decision.
