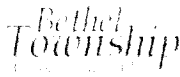

# BETHEL TOWNSHIP ELECTRIC GOVERNMENT AGGREGATION PROGRAM WITH AEP ENERGY

Dear <First> <Last>:

Bethel Township is providing you with the opportunity to participate with other Bethel Township residents in an opt-out electric aggregation program, with AEP Energy as your electricity supply provider. AEP Energy is an Ohio-based company and a subsidiary of American Electric Power (AEP).

Under governmental aggregation, the Bethel Township Trustees/Board Members act on behalf of electric consumers in Bethel Township to negotiate an electric supply contract with an eligible provider. Both Bethel Township and eligible retail electricity suppliers have to be certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. Bethel Township Trustees/Board Members passed an ordinance to adopt the program after Bethel Township voters approved its implementation on May 4, 2014. The new Electric Aggregation Program for Bethel Township will begin within one to two billing cycles following your inclusion as a participant in the Township's program and end with your October 2017 billing cycle.

**Under this Electric Aggregation Program, eligible residents in Bethel Township, starting with the October 2015 billing cycle (depending on your meter-read date), will pay 5.588 cents per kWh through the October 2017 billing cycle, for a period of twenty-four (24) months.** There is no cost for the enrollment and you will not be charged a switching fee. AEP Energy's price applies to the generation portion of your electricity bill. If you are ever unhappy with your service or price from AEP Energy, you may cancel free of charge at any time and return to DP&L at a rate and terms that may or may not be the same as what other DP&L customers pay.

After you become a participant in the Township's Electric aggregation program, DP&L will send a letter confirming your selection of AEP Energy as your electricity supply provider. As required by law, this letter will inform you of your option to cancel your enrollment with AEP Energy within seven calendar days of its postmark date. To remain in the Township's Electric Aggregation Program, you don't need to take any action when this letter arrives. You will be automatically enrolled.

Under the Electric Aggregation Program, DP&L will continue to maintain the wires system that delivers power to your home. You will still contact DP&L regarding loss of power service or for any other concerns or issues having to do with your electric service. You will continue to receive a single bill from DP&L for your electricity service with your lower AEP Energy price included.

If you do **not** wish to participate in this program, you must "opt-out." There are two ways to opt-out; by calling the AEP Energy Customer Care Team toll free at 1-844-258-8042, Monday - Friday from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm EST and Saturday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm EST or by completing the Electric Aggregation "Opt-Out" Election Form below. Your "Opt-Out" Election Form must be returned by September 21, 2015.

Under the Electric Aggregation Program, the Township acted on behalf of its electricity consumers to select an electricity supply provider who, through the power of volume buying, is able to secure electricity at competitive prices. The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO") has taken steps to ensure that Ohio's competitive electricity environment is consumer-friendly.

Bethel Township has selected AEP Energy as their preferred electricity supply provider to serve their residents beginning with the October 2015 billing cycle for a period of twenty-four (24) months.

### **Who is AEP Energy?**

AEP Energy is a certified Competitive Retail Electric Service (CRES) provider and a subsidiary of American Electric Power (AEP). With an office located in Columbus, Ohio, AEP Energy sells electricity supply to customers at market-based prices rather than regulated rates offered by your local utility.

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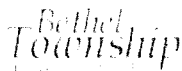

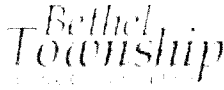

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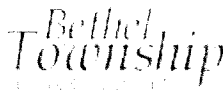

Ohio Edison will be responsible for the delivery of power to your home. Since your local utility still owns the wires and poles that deliver power to you, it will continue to read your meter and restore power after an outage. #### Where do I send payment?

**CONDITIONS.** These Terms and Conditions (this "Agreement") are your agreement for Generation Service with AEP Energy, Inc. ("AEP Energy"). Please keep a copy of this Agreement for your records. AEP Energy is certified by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio ("PUCO") to offer and supply Generation Service in Ohio. As a Competitive Retail Electric Service ("CRES") provider, AEP Energy will supply the electric generation services to your Electric Distribution Utility ("EDU") based on your usage. All electricity will be supplied and delivered under the aggregation program, which is governed by the Government Aggregation Master Retail Supply Agreement between the relevant government aggregator and AEP Energy (the "Program Agreement"). Your EDU then distributes or delivers the electricity to you. Your Distribution Service will remain with your current EDU, which is regulated by the PUCO.

**DEFINITIONS:** "Competitive Retail Electric Service Provider" or "CRES" provider means, as defined by Chapter 4901:1-21 of the Substantive Rules applicable to electric service providers, an entity that sells electric energy to retail customers in Ohio. "Generation Service" means the production of electricity. "Generation-Related Charges" means those charges or costs associated with the production, procurement and supply of electricity. "Non-bypassable utility charges and fees" means those EDU charges and fees payable by you regardless of whether the EDU or a CRES provides Generation Service. "Transmission Services" means moving high voltage electricity from a generation facility to the distribution lines of an EDU. "Distribution Service" means the physical delivery of electricity to customers by the EDU.

**RIGHT OF RESCISSION.** Once you have been enrolled to receive Generation Service from AEP Energy, your EDU will send you a confirmation letter. You have the right to rescind your enrollment without penalty within seven (7) calendar days following the postmark date of the confirmation letter by contacting your EDU and following the instructions contained in the letter. In the event the EDU's retail electric choice program is terminated or materially changed in any manner prior to the end of the initial Term or renewal thereof, AEP Energy may terminate this Agreement, without penalty to either party.

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

1. **Eligibility.** Residential customer accounts that are on residential rates codes and are not enrolled in the Percentage of Income Plan



