SINGH: My name is Sarbjit 2.0 Singh, my address 3603 Farm Hurst Lane, 2.1 Columbus, Ohio. 22 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Thank you. Are

6 1 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Do you have any 2 witnesses to call? 3 MR. LINDGREN: Yes, I do. Thank 4 you, your Honor. Staff calls as its first witness Mark Irmscher. 5 6 (WITNESS SWORN) 7 OFFICER MARK IRMSCHER 8 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, testified as follows: 9 10 DIRECT EXAMINATION By Mr. Lindgren: 11 12 Q. Good morning, sir. 13 A. Good morning. 14 Would you please state your full name for the record? 15 16 Α. Mark Irmscher. 17 And what is your business address? Q. It's West Jeff, West Jefferson Post, 18 Α. out of West Jefferson, Ohio is the Post I am 19 2.0 assigned out of. 2.1 Q. Where are you employed? 22 Α. Where? 23 Yes. What agency? 24 Α. It's Motor Carrier Enforcement 25 Division for the Highway Patrol out of the West

Jeff Post.

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- Thank you. And what is your position with the Ohio Highway Patrol?
- 4 Α. I am a Motor Carrier Enforcement 5 Inspector.
- How long have you been in that 0. 7 position?
  - In this Division approximately 15 Α. years.
  - 0. And what are your duties as a Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer?
    - Dealing with commercial vehicles out on the highway, promoting safety, inspecting vehicles and drivers.
    - 0. What training have you received in connection with your duties?
    - There is several courses we had to Α. complete in the North American Standards, which would be -- there is your general inspections and your hazardous materials inspections.
- 2.1 We had to complete all those courses 22 prior to doing our position.
- 23 Thank you. Do you recall inspecting 0. 24 a commercial motor vehicle driven by the 25 Respondent, Mr. Singh?

A. Yes, sir.

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- Q. And what was the reason for this inspection?
- A. It was an obvious violation. I was sitting on Frank Road and I observed the vehicle, came up to a traffic light and there was no brake lights on the trailer. And that was the reason for making the stop.
- Q. Thank you. Other than the brake lights did you find any other violations during this inspection?
- A. Brake lights, and there were other marker lights and a brake chamber was defective on the trailer. And the driver failed to have corrective lenses on at the time.
- Q. Was the driver required to wear corrective lenses?
- A. That's correct. He has a B restriction on his license, which means he has to have corrective lenses on at all times.
- Q. Did you examine his driver's license to make that determination?
- A. Yes, I did. I noticed it had the B restriction on the license.
  - Q. Did you see his eyeglasses anywhere

in the cab?

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- A. None. I asked the driver about the glasses and he just pointed to his right side, but there was no glasses in plain sight anywhere.
- Q. Did he make any statements to you about the glasses?
  - A. Yes, he did. He said -- he stated to me that he only needed them for driving at night. And I returned by telling the driver he needs to wear them at all times.
- Q. Did the license say anything about driving at night?
- A. No, sir. It just had the B restriction, which means corrective lenses must be worn at all times.
- Q. Thank you. Did you prepare any report that reflects the findings of your inspection?
- 20 A. Yes, sir.
- MR. LINDGREN: Thank you. May I approach?
- 23 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You may.

10 1 MR. LINDGREN: Let the record 2 reflect that I am handing the witness what I 3 have marked for identification purposes as Staff 4 Exhibit 1. 5 Ο. Mr. Irmscher, do you recognize this document? 6 7 Α. Yes, sir. 8 Ο. And what is it? 9 It's a vehicle inspection report 10 that we issued to the driver when we completed 11 the inspection. 12 Q. And was this prepared at the time of 13 your inspection of the vehicle driven by Mr. 14 Singh? 15 Α. Yes, sir. 16 And does it accurately reflect the Ο. 17 findings of your inspection? 18 Α. Yes, sir. 19 And does this document appear to 2.0 have been altered since you prepared it? 2.1 Α. No. sir. 22 And what did you do with this report Q. after you prepared it? 23 24 We just -- we have to upload the Α. 25 inspection to our Safer website, which then in

return ended up going to the PUCO for review.

- O. And what is Safer?
- A. That's a computer program that we have to initiate at the end of the inspection so that the inspection report can be saved.
- Q. Thank you. Does this report note all of the violations you found in the course of your inspection?
- 9 A. Yes, sir.
- MR. LINDGREN: Thank you. I have
  no further questions, and the witness is
  available for cross-examination.
- 13 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Mr. Singh, do
  14 you have any questions for this witness?
- 15 CROSS-EXAMINATION
- 16 By Mr. Singh:

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- 17 O. Sir, did I show you my glasses?
- 18 A. I am sorry.
- Q. Did I show you my glasses to check it in your hand?
- A. No, you did not show me your glasses.
- Q. I showed you the glasses, sir.
- 24 A. No, sir.
- 25 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Excuse me. You

have to ask questions now. You are not testify yourself.

MR. SINGH: Okay.

- Q. Then why don't you write that down I don't have glasses? Why not you write down in the violation I don't have glasses?
- Q. The violation is on the report for the restrictions. It says "Driver not wearing glasses when stopped."
  - Q. And what does it mean by see notes?
  - A. These are --
- 12 Q. At the bottom.

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- A. It's a program, or it's a program in our computer that helps refresh in my memory on the stop.
- Q. Did you see me when I driving?
- 17 A. No, I did not see you.
- Q. Did you see me when you checked me
  that -- when you give me a light, did you see my
  glasses?
  - A. I did not see no glasses at all.
- Q. Did you see I don't read the glasses?
- 24 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You have to ask 25 questions of the witness.

1 MR. SINGH: I asked him when I 2 driving and he stopped me did he see me that I 3 be in the glasses or not. 4 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: I think he had 5 answered the question. I did not see glasses. 6 Α. 7 Q. Okay. Sir. 8 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: I think that's 9 the answer you have to go with and now you have 10 to come up with another question. 11 MR. SINGH: That would be all, sir. 12 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You have no 13 more? 14 MR. SINGH: No more. 15 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You are excused. 16 I am sorry. Did you have any --17 MR. LINDGREN: No redirect, your 18 Honor. Staff next calls Jonathan Frye to the 19 stand. 2.0 (WITNESS SWORN) 2.1 22 JONATHAN FRYE 23 called as a witness, being first duly sworn, 24 testified as follows: 25 DIRECT EXAMINATION

By Mr. Lindgren:

- Q. Good morning, sir. Could you please state your full name for the record?
  - A. Jonathan Frye.
  - Q. And where is your business address?
- A. 180 East Broad Street, Columbus,
- 7 Ohio 43215.

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- Q. And where are you employed?
- 9 A. Public Utilities Commission of Ohio,
  10 Transportation Department.
- 11 Q. What is your position there?
- 12 A. I am the Chief of Compliance.
- Q. And what are your duties as Chief of Compliance?
- 15 A. To review the fine assessments that
  16 are assessed against drivers, shippers and
  17 carriers.
- 18 Q. How long have you been in that position?
- 20 A. Approximately 12 years.
- Q. And what training did you receive for this position?
- A. I have gone through the North

  America Out of Service Training Parts A and B,

  the hazardous materials training, gone through

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supervisory training as well.
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- Q. Thank you. Did you review the forfeiture assessed against the Respondent in this case, Mr. Singh?
- A. Yes.

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6 MR. LINDGREN: Thank you. May I approach?

8 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: You may.

MR. LINDGREN: Thank you. Let the record reflect that I am handing the witness what I have marked for identification purposes as Staff Exhibit 2.

- Q. Mr. Frye, do you recognize this document?
- 17 A. Yes.
- 18 Q. And could you explain what that is?
- A. It's a Notice of Preliminary

  Determination letter. It's a letter that is

  sent to a particular driver when we are unable

  to reach a resolution of his case during a

  settlement conference.
- What the document does, it provides instructions on how to pay the fine, as well as

instructions on how to contest the violation at the administrative hearing level.

- Q. And does this notice reflect the forfeiture assessed against the Respondent here?
- A. That's correct. It assesses a \$250 forfeiture against the driver.
- Q. Could you explain how that forfeiture amount was arrived at?
- A. Yes. After the violation is uploaded and then downloaded to the PUCO the violations are broken up into four different groups. And based upon the type of violation, and severity of the violations, a dollar amount is assigned to the various violations.

And it's based upon the recommended fine schedule of the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Alliance.

- Q. Thank you. Would this amount be consistent with forfeitures assessed other drivers for similar violations?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. And would this be the amount you recommend the Commission assess if it finds that Mr. Singh committed the violation?
- 25 A. Yes.
