




It has been brought to my attention that energy companies Duke Energy, AEP, and First Energy have filed proposals with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio in order to request permission to increase the rates that citizens of Ohio would have to pay on their electric bills, in order to cover the costs of a number of outdated and inefficient coal power plants. Technically, this can be classified as a bailout for these companies. This issue has the case numbers of 14-1297-EL-SSO and 14-1693-EL-SSO.

As a citizen of Ohio, I urge you to deny this rate increase, and to not bailout these companies in order to save these grossly outdated plants for many reasons. First and foremost, me and many others do not wish to have to pay even more for electricity. Money is already tight, and this financial burden should not need to be placed on the citizens. Since when has paying for a company's mistake become the responsibility of the citizens?

In addition, the environmental cost of continuing to run these plants is simply too high. The environment is something that is important to me and my family because it simply is the very world that we live in. Trashing it will not make it last for future generations. Dear Public Utilities Commission of Ohio,

As you are aware, we get far too much of our energy from coal and other forms of fossil fuels. Add renewable energy, like wind and solar. But please, don't continue to undermine the citizens you represent and generations to come by supporting these damaging, environmentally-detrimental energy sources.

I wrote my college thesis on the viability of producing wind energy in Lake Erie. As it turns out, it is entirely possible, provided we put forth a little effort. The same can be said about solar energy, which, even in the gray winter skies of Cleveland is competitive in terms of market prices.

Perhaps, if it is done the correct way by partnering with the renewable energy companies, the coal miners can be trained in the new industries.

This doesn't have to be about elections or who is currently in charge. This doesn't need to be four or eight years of one ruling party followed by the other political party. This is Ohio. We are incredibly innovative. Why can't this be about defying odds, by transitioning Ohio into a more environmentally-friendly and energy-diverse state? There is a lot to gain from diversifying, and very little to lose. Please, please keep that in mind.


Dear P.U.C.O:


Stop the bailout of the inefficient old technology of these very profitable power plants that have taken so much from us and given back very little except their pollution.
