Dear Governor Kasich and the PUCO,



My family and I care about reducing toxic pollution in our environment, particularly in our air, not just because it is the right thing to do for the earth, but selfishly because one of our daughters suffers from asthma. Coal and oil burning fuel plants can be enormous polluters of the air when they are not required to improve, and air pollution makes it hard for our seven-year-old to breathe. Bailing out older, polluting technology delays investment in efficiency improvements and the pursuit of renewable energy resources.

We also care about rising electric and utility bills; improvements in technology should enable utility companies to achieve greater efficiencies in their processes while maintaining the same costs or even improving costs over time. We see no justification for ~~increasing~~ the utility rates that makes sense; in fact, allowing the raising of rates delays utility companies' investment in efficient technology or renewable resources.

Other businesses need to find efficiencies in their operations in order to continue to thrive or perish; public utilities should be required to adhere to the same market forces in order to improve. Surely, if they can afford to spend well over \$800,000 on political campaign contributions (as reported by the National Institute on Money in State Politics), they should be able to find improvements to their processes that cover those costs along with the costs of adhering to Ohio's clean energy standards, which have been on the books for over five years.

Dear Commissioners;

We are writing as citizens of the state of Ohio to express our views concerning electric utilities.

First: A great many families are feeling the economic pinch of our times. Few of us can afford wildly fluctuating rates, or steep price increases.


Second: Pollution and toxic waste in our air or water supplies are no longer acceptable to us.
