As a small business owner in Ohio, and as a resident, I feel it is necessary to write in opposition to PUCO cases 14-1297-EL-SSO and 14-1693-EL-SSO. My reasons for opposing these measures:

1. They add unnecessary expense to both my business and personal finances. These proposed increases may force my business to increase our prices, as we must pass along costs of electrical power on to our customers for websites we are hosting for them. It would also encourage us to move our spending for data centers to other states.
2. This kind of meddling in competitive markets by favoring one means of providing a product over another as a matter of public policy reduces market efficiency. If these aging power plants are truly more efficient than their competitors, then let them prove it by offering power at a lower price than other sources can provide.
3. Aging power plants cause more pollution than more modern plants and certainly more than renewable energy sources. This pollution creates additional hidden costs above and beyond the simple cost of the rate increase:
 - a) Increased costs to municipal water systems to clean polluted water to meet current standards for potability. These must then be passed along to homeowners and businesses in the form of increased water bills.





My family and I care about reducing toxic pollution and saving money on our electric bills. First Energy and American Electric Power have proposals pending at the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) for financial bailouts of the Kyger Creek, Clifty Creek, W.H. Sammis, Stuart, Zimmer, Cardinal and Conesville coal plants, and the Davis-Besse nuclear power plant. The estimated price tag to bail out FirstEnergy's Sammis coal plant and Davis-Besse nuclear plant alone is now estimated at \$4-5 billion and climbing.

I am under the impression that the utilities want to force us to buy the power from these old expensive plants, for eight years or more.
