I would like to express my opposition to the request of Dayton Power and Light to increase their rates.

I am 83 years of age, a widow whose income is \$2000.00 a month less since my husband passed away, but with the same bills only now I have to pay someone to do the necessary repairs, etc.

Dayton Power & Light is always urging us to look for a cheaper provider, and to make sure we do not waste electric. I have done both of these, but Dayton Power and Light's distribution rates are ALWAYS higher each month than the electric provider - First Energy.

I have listed a summary of my Dayton Power and Light Bills for the year of 2015, showing that each month their distribution rates exceed the electric rates. Now they want to raise them again!! When will this end? The nonbypassable charge that you granted them (not a reason for it) increases my bill by \$120.00 a year.
