## Dear Public Utilities Commission of Ohio,

I Vladislav Bubnovskiy, truck driver of the company Sealy Mattress Co (Address: 1070 Lake Road Medina, OH 44256), was subject to a vehicle inspection which occurred on December $8^{\text {th }} 2015$ at 3:10PM EST regarding case \# OH1651009889D. In the report (page $\qquad$ ) the Trooper noted under violations "Using a hand-held mobile telephone while operating a CMV: driver was holding a cellular phone up to his right ear when I looked up into the cab". I am writing to dispute this claim for the following reasons:

1. After the traffic stop the Trooper Brian Man immediately seized my phone and investigated the telephone call history which confirmed the fact that I did not place a call while I was operating the vehicle NOR had I received a call while operating the vehicle during the time in question per Trooper Brian Hann.
2. The Trooper Brian Hen stated that I "must have deleted my phone history and thus am lying about not having used my phone".
3. Had I needed to make a phone call I would certainly have used the Bluetooth "Hands-Free" connection which my company provides in ALL trucks which has always been installed in my truck. I have included additional photographs of my interior cabin and of the hands-free feature available on this Bluetooth radio model. (page 5,6)
4. I have obtained records from my cell phone company "SPRINT" which is in question pertaining to the timing of the trooper's claim regarding my use of a cell phone while driving. The records indicate during the time of the traffic stop, no calls were placed or received which supports my claim to the trooper and is contradictory to the statement made by Trooper Brian Hen that "I must have deleted the call history". (page,$\frac{8}{2}$ )
5. Additional documents which I have included are my Driver's log for the day indicating I was well within my operational safety rules and regulations. According to the electronic driver's log, at the time of said inspection, I had already been driving over 10 hours. (page $910,1 /$ ) and as such was massaging my neck using my right hand. At this moment, the trooper was located on the driver's side lane driving along the rear axle of my trailer. I can only infer that from this distant and obscure angle, he may have seen me massage my right neck with my right hand through the side mirror and simply mistook me for being on my phone.

I believe this case should be dismissed as I had previously pleaded my case to the trooper during the inspection that I was completely mistaken for someone who was using a cell phone while driving but did not have any evidence during the traffic stop to refute the word of the trooper. I currently have a clean drivers record and would like the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio to consider the above referenced points regarding my telephone records, availability of Bluetooth in my cabin in the event I would need to place or accept a phone call, and drivers logs indicating my extended
driving history pertaining to the day explaining why I was massaging my neck with my right hand.

In addition, I have also prepared a written request for administrative hearing regarding this case as detailed in the response letter pursuant to rule 4901:2-7-13, O.A.C. . Within this request ! have also noted the need for a Russian/English Interpreter who would assist in translational services during the administrative hearing.
