FINDING AND ORDER

The Commission finds:

- (1) Glacial Energy of Ohio, Inc. (Glacial) is an electric services company as defined in R.C. 4928.01(A)(9) and, as such, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.
- (2) R.C. 4928.64(B)(2) establishes benchmarks for electric services companies to acquire a portion of their electricity supply for retail customers in Ohio from renewable energy resources. R.C. 4928.645 provides that an electric utility or electric services company may use renewable energy credits (RECs) and solar energy credits (SRECs) to meet its respective renewable energy and solar benchmarks. Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-01(BB) defines a REC as the environmental attributes associated with one megawatt hour (MWh) of electricity generated by a renewable energy resource, except for electricity generated by facilities as described in Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-04(E).
- (3) Ohio Adm.Code 4901:1-40-05(A) requires each electric services company to annually file by April 15 an alternative energy portfolio status report (AEPS report), unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. The AEPS report must analyze all activities the company undertook in the previous year in order to demonstrate how pertinent alternative energy portfolio benchmarks have been met. Staff then conducts an annual compliance review of the company's filing and the records of the applicable attribute tracking system to ensure that RECs were sourced from generating facilities certified by the Commission and were appropriately associated with electricity generated for the compliance period.

- (4) On April 15, 2015, Glacial filed its 2014 AEPS report, proposing to use a compliance baseline of 1,125,732 MWH, which it indicated was an average of its Ohio retail electric sales for 2011, 2012, and 2013. In addition, Glacial reported that it satisfied its 2014 compliance obligations.
- (5) On December 11, 2015, Staff filed a report of its Review and Recommendations for Glacial's 2014 AEPS report. Staff reports that Glacial is an electric services company in the state of Ohio, and thus had an AEPS obligation for 2014. Staff reviewed Glacial's attribute tracking system account record to verify compliance, and determined that Glacial has satisfied its 2014 compliance obligations. Further, Staff recommends that, for future compliance years, Glacial initiate the transfer of the appropriate RECs and SRECs to its attribute tracking system reserve subaccounts between March 1 and April 15 so as to precede the filing of its annual AEPS report with the Commission.
- (6) Upon review of Glacial's 2014 AEPS report, and the records of these proceedings, we adopt Staff's recommendations. We find that Glacial's 2014 proposed compliance baseline is reasonable, and that Glacial has met its compliance obligations for 2014. Further, Glacial is directed to comply with Staff's recommendations for future compliance years.


It is, therefore,

ORDERED, That Glacial has met its AEPS compliance obligations for 2014, and its 2014 AEPS report is accepted as filed. It is, further,


ORDERED, That Glacial comply with Staff's recommendations adopted herein. It is, further,

ORDERED, That a copy of this Finding and Order be served upon all parties of record.






