COMMENTS: Please add my name to the list of Blue Ash residents who have already filed letters of complaint against the Duke Energy proposed 30" transmission pipeline that could run through our neighborhood.

Points have already been raised regarding the possible significant loss of green space we currently enjoy. The privacy and beauty of our neighborhood will be adversely affected by the proposed pink route pipeline.

I also understand that today's pipeline technology is superior to that of the infamous San Bruno disaster, but still failures do occur. Always present is the possible defective weld, joint leakage, pipe deformation, pipe wall ruptures, 3rd party accidents and vandalism, etc. This leads me to a factor that I feel is most significant.

The proposed pink route (including its' reroute) comes into an unsafe close proximity of UC Blue Ash College, Blue Ash Elementary School and a day care facility. (I do not believe any of these three have been notified about the proposed pipeline) Hundreds of children, and thousands of teens and young adults attend classes at these institutions daily.

To the best of my knowledge the San Bruno 30" pipeline was installed when that area was relatively unpopulated. Decades of urban sprawl contributed to the explosion's widespread destruction and loss of life.

But our Blue Ash area is already well developed with homes, a university, an elementary school and day care. It honestly amazes me that Duke Energy would even consider such a route through this populated area. Surely common sense safety concerns have to outweigh making a profit.
