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ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Let's go on the record. Good morning. The Public Utilities

Commission of Ohio calls for hearing at this time and place Case No. 15-2029-TR-CVF, being In the Matter of Kenneth Wylie, Notice of Apparent Violation and Intent to Assess Forfeiture. My name is Bryce

McKenney, and I'm the Attorney Examiner assigned by the Commission to hear this case.

At this time I'd like to take the appearances of the parties. On behalf of Staff.

MR. MARGARD: Thank you, your Honor. On behalf of the Transportation Staff of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio, Mike DeWine, Ohio Attorney General, William L. Wright, Section Chief, Public Utilities Section, by Assistant Attorney General Werner L. Margard, 180 East Broad Street, 6th Floor, Columbus, Ohio.

ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Thank you, Mr. Margard.

At this time I'd like to note for the record the Respondent has not arrived for hearing in this matter. It is now 10:15.

Proceedings 5 1 Mr. Margard. 2 MR. MARGARD: Thank you, your Honor. 3 would like to proceed by calling the inspectors, if I may, just for completeness of the record. I would 4 5 first call Inspector Richards to the stand. 6 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Okay. 7 Inspector Richards, please raise your right hand. 8 (Inspector Richards was sworn.) 9 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: You may be 10 seated. 11 12 INSPECTOR ROBERT K. RICHARDS, 13 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 14 examined and testified as follows: 15 DIRECT EXAMINATION 16 BY MR. MARGARD: 17 Q. Please state your name. 18 Robert Keith Richards. Α. 19 And by whom are you employed and in what 0. 20 capacity? 2.1 The State of Ohio, and the State Highway Α. 22 Patrol. 23 Were you on duty on August 5th, 2015? Q.

And in the course of your duties on that

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date did you have the opportunity to conduct an inspection of a vehicle being driven by the Respondent in this case, Kenneth Wylie?

A. Yes, sir.

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- Q. Can you please explain the circumstances that resulted in that inspection?
- A. Me and my co-inspector were heading to a location of an enforcement blitz. As we were coming up to the back of the trailer of said person, we heard the rumble strips of the tires. We both looked over and saw that the truck was almost completely over the white line onto the rumble strips. At that point we were catching up to him, and he was slowing down. My co-inspector noticed that he was on his phone. I then looked over, noticed that he was on his phone as well. I backed off, got behind him. We followed him for a mile or two and made the traffic stop.
- Q. When you say that he was on his phone, you were able to physically see the phone in his hand?
- A. Yes. We both saw him and the phone not in his face but above the steering wheel looking at the phone.
 - Q. Okay. And did you, as a result of your

7 inspection, generate a report? 1 2 A. Yes, sir. 3 MR. MARGARD: May I approach, your Honor? 4 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: You may. 5 MR. MARGARD: Your Honor, I have marked 6 7 for purposes of identification as Staff Exhibit No. 1. 8 9 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: So marked. 10 (EXHIBIT MARKED FOR IDENTIFICATION.) 11 BY MR. MARGARD: 12 Q. Inspector Richards, do you have before 13 you Staff Exhibit 1? 14 Yes, sir. Α. 15 Q. Is this a copy of the report that you 16 generated? 17 Yes, sir. Α. 18 Q. And what was the violation that you 19 determined? 20 Α. That the driver was using a hand-held 2.1 device and it caused him to go off the right side of 2.2 the road. Q. Did you have a conversation with the 23 24 driver? 25 A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Did he offer an explanation?
- A. He offered several.
- Q. Can you share some of those with us?
- A. Co-Inspector Leite was the one that made the initial approach. I stood back as backup because it was my stop, and I believe he said --

Richards, did you hear him say this yourself?

THE WITNESS: Some of it. I didn't hear

10 all of it.

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11 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Just tell
12 us what you heard.

- A. That -- Matt asked him if he was texting on the phone. He said no. He said he was getting directions. Matt said okay, but you still can't use a phone in that nature.
- Q. So he acknowledge in your presence anyway that he was using his phone at the time of the stop?
- A. I heard him say he was using it to get directions.
- Q. Okay. To the best of your knowledge, is this report accurate?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- MR. MARGARD: Your Honor, I have no

9 further questions for Inspector Richards. 1 2 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Thank you. 3 4 EXAMINATION 5 BY ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Inspector Richards, I have a few 6 Q. 7 questions. What type of vehicle were you in when you 8 approached? 9 Α. My vehicle, sir? 10 Q. Yes. 11 It's a 2012 Chevy pursuit-rated Tahoe. Α. 12 Is that vehicle marked? Q. 13 Α. Yes, sir. 14 Were you in uniform? Ο. 15 Α. Yes, sir. Not in this uniform, but our 16 other. 17 Thank you. Can you describe the vehicle Q. 18 you approached? 19 I cannot tell you the color, but I know 20 it was a 2014 Kenworth and a 2011 utility trailer. 2.1 It was marked with not -- Navajo Express, 22 Incorporated. 23 Q. Do you know approximately what time of 24 day it was?

The report says it was 7:58.

10 Do you know what the weather was like on 1 Q. 2 that day? 3 No, I do not, sir. Do you remember what mile marker you 4 Ο. 5 were at? The report says 133. 6 Α. ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Thank you. 7 I have no further questions. 8 9 (Witness excused.) 10 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: 11 Margard. 12 MR. MARGARD: Thank you, your Honor. I 13 would call Inspector Leite. 14 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Inspector, 15 would you please raise your right hand? 16 (Inspector Leite was sworn.) 17 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Thank you. 18 You may be seated. 19 20 INSPECTOR MATTHEW LEITE, 2.1 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 2.2 examined and testified as follows:

> Q. Will you please state your name.

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BY MR. MARGARD:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

- A. Matthew Leite.
- Q. Inspector; is that correct?
- A. Yes, correct.

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- Q. Inspector Leite, by whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A. Ohio State Highway Patrol as a Motor Carrier Enforcement Inspector.
- Q. You've been present during the hearing thus far; is that correct?
 - A. Correct, sir.
- Q. And you heard the testimony from Inspector Richards; right?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. Do you have anything to add in terms of your observations or your discussions with the driver?
 - A. I -- we both observed the driver going completely past the rumble strips off the right side of the road. We were in the turning lane portion of the Ohio Turnpike. We were in Lane No. 2, the middle lane, already in the process of passing him on the way to the enforcement blitz. Once we observed him past the right side of the road, the white line and the rumble strips, we pulled beside him.
- I observed the driver holding a phone in

his hand. At that point, Inspector Richards slowed down to get behind the vehicle and initiate the stop. I made a passenger-side approach on the vehicle at that time to initiate the inspection. I asked the driver what he was doing when he went off the side of the road. At that time he told me he was attempting to get a drink of coffee. I then said sir, I observed a phone in your hand, what were you doing, and he said he was using it to get directions.

- Q. Do you have anything further to add with respect to this inspection?
 - A. Not at this time, no.
- Q. The report is accurate and truthful, to the best of your knowledge?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. As was Inspector Richards' testimony?
- A. Yes, sir.

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18 MR. MARGARD: I have nothing further for 19 Inspector Leite.

I 6 7 would call Staff witness Tom Persinger. 8 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Please 9 raise your right hand. 10 (Mr. Persinger was sworn.) 11 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: Thank you. 12 You may be seated. 13 14 THOMAS PERSINGER, 15 being first duly sworn, as prescribed by law, was 16 examined and testified as follows: 17 DIRECT EXAMINATION 18 BY MR. MARGARD: Your Honor, may I 19 approach? 20 ATTORNEY EXAMINER McKENNEY: You may. 2.1 Marked as Staff Exhibit 2? 22 MR. MARGARD: Yes, your Honor. Thank
