COMMENT DESCRIPTION:

Duke Energy is proposing an extensive pipeline extension right through a densely populated area (referred to as the GREEN Line) of our beutiful neighborhood. north and south through Park Hills. The current siting of the GREEN LINE has it running on the north side of Glendale Milford Road until it is west of Park Hills property, where it will then cross to the south side. However, this siting is not yet fixed and subject to change. If the GREEN LINE is selected and the pipeline is sited on the south side of Glendale Milford Road, the impact on Park Hills homeowners would be terrible. Not only would all owners see property values decline, people would begin to leave. In addition to this, we would experince risks and extreme trafiic issues during implementation of this project. Please make note of the very active, high sentiment against this proposed project here in our communities. It's something everyone is talking about, and no one wants.
