{¶ 1} A prehearing conference was held in this case on May 26, 2016, but the parties were unable to resolve the matter. At the prehearing conference, a hearing date of August 2, 2016, was established.

{¶ 2} Accordingly, this case should be scheduled for hearing on August 2, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. in the offices of the Commission, in Hearing Room 11-D, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215-3793.

{¶ 3} Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-14(E), provides that a respondent who has requested an administrative hearing and fails to participate in the hearing proceeding shall be in default. The rule additionally states that a respondent in default shall be deemed to have admitted the occurrence of the violation and waived all further right to contest liability to the state for the forfeiture described in the notice.

{¶ 4} At the hearing, Staff must prove, by a preponderance of the evidence, that respondent committed the alleged violation, pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 4901:2-7-20(A).

{¶ 5} Following Staff's presentation of evidence at the hearing, it shall be the responsibility of the respondent, Terry Colletti, to present evidence in support of his contentions regarding the alleged violations in this matter.

{¶ **6}** It is, therefore,

{¶ 7} ORDERED, That a hearing be scheduled as indicated in paragraph (2). It is, further,

{¶ **8}** ORDERED, That a copy of this Entry be served upon all parties of record.
