The Duke Energy Proposal to run a 30" high pressure transmission line through much of Suburban Cincinnati is unconscionable and shows a disregard for the welfare of families, schools and businesses along the proposed routes. Officials withing the siting board, local and state politicians surely are aware that this will bring harm to the people they are called to serve. From environmental damage to neighborhoods, loss of property values and the risk of catastrophic accidents, I hope that all involved in the process recognize that these transmission lines have no place running through neighborhoods within Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. I am adamantly opposed to the Central Corridor as proposed.
