Have Duke Energy engineers designed for the potential of significant seismic events that this area has experienced in the past, or potential tampering by hateful people wanting to destroy large numbers of people? I seriously question that Duke could develop enough safety measures in their pipeline to overcome these kinds of events. And why take the chance?
