Each of the three routes proposed by Duke Energy for it's Central Corridor Extension Pipeline poses a danger to residential areas. Running a pipeline of this magnitude - which is far larger than the State of Ohio needs - in a residential area endangers public safety. It also potentially reduces property values causing lower tax revenues. The pipeline also damages the environmental integrity of the land. The Ohio Power Sitting Board needs to consider our quality of life and actual need for this quantity of gas especially when there are alternative investments in green technology such as solar and wind resources that are not attached to fracking and the poisoning of many citizens.
