## A Resolution Expressing Opposition to Duke Energy's Central Corridor Pipeline Extension Project as Proposed Through the City of Reading

Whereas, Duke Energy has proposed a 30", high pressure natural gas pipeline from the Mason area to the Norwood area called the Central Corridor Gas Pipeline Extension Project; and

Whereas, Duke has publicly shown three options for the location of said pipeline, one which would negatively impact the city of Reading, its residents and its corporate citizens greatly; and

Whereas, the safety of Reading's citizens is a top priority for the Council of the City of Reading and recent events in Pennsylvania demonstrate that such installations can fail with catastrophic results: and

Whereas, the proposed route through Reading abuts or is near many places of Public Assembly including the Municipal Swimming Pool and Field House, Veterans Memorial Stadium, The Public Library, as well as the many private homes and businesses in this highly urbanized area, thus exposing great numbers to this potential danger, and

Whereas, the presence of such a pipeline within the public right-of-way could adversely impact the management and maintenance of that right of way by the city's Public Works Department;

Whereas, the proposed pipeline would likely diminish the desirability of living near or establishing/ maintaining a business near its path, resulting in lower property values. loss of personal wealth and public tax revenues, community disinvestment, and general economic hardship: and

Whereas, the proposed route would, in particular, Jeopardize are successful reactions.

two sites key to Reading's efforts at economic sustainability and would put at great risk the investment of nearly three million dollars in public grant funds from the State of Ohio and other authorities, and

Whereas, traffic disruptions, environmental damage, noise, and other inconvenience owing to the construction of this pipeline would be suffered disproportionately by an economically disadvantaged populace, and

Whereas, Council finds and determines after review of information made available to date that it is necessary to express our opposition to the pipeline as proposed,

Now, therefore, be it resolved:

Section 1 The Council of the City of Reading does hereby express its strong opposition to the placement of the natural gas pipeline as proposed through the City limits.
