As a member of the City of Reading Council, and a lifelong resident of the city of Reading, I am compelled to voice my opposition to Duke Energy's proposed central corridor extension pipeline. Considering Reading Council just passed, and forwarded on to you, a resolution (#2016-45R) voicing the entire council's concerns, I will keep this personal email short and to the point.

My main concern is with the "green route" that takes the pipeline through the heart of Reading including our recreational facilities, industrial and business properties and three potential new development sites including one that the state and city have invested \$3 million in to make it shovel ready for biotech development. But the greatest impact would be to our residents living anywhere near the proposed route.
