Weirton man sentenced to 97 months for child pornography

WHEELING

WHEELING — A Weirton man was sentenced Tuesday to 97 months in prison for receiving, possessing and distributing images of child pornography. U.S. Attorney William J. Ihlenfeld II said.

Steve G. Singo, 35, was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Frederick P. Stamp Jr. in Wheeling following his conviction in March on one count each of receipt and distribution of child pornography and possession of child pornography. Evidence presented at trial by Assistant U.S. Attorney Stephen Vogrin indicated that Singo used Internet-based peer-to-peer file sharing technology to download and share files depicting minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct. The incidents occurred in July 2013 and October 2013 in southern Hancock County.

An investigation by the West Virginia State Police, including online surveillance, revealed that Singo was in possession of various images of child pornography at his residence, Ihlenfeld said.

He and two other Hancock County men were indicted by a federal grand jury in April 2015 following investigations by the state police and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. The other two men, one from Weirton and one from Chester, pleaded guilty in August 2015.

The indictment against Singo included a provision seeking the forfeiture of a laptop computer, four hard drives and two USB thumb drives that were seized on Oct. 8, 2013.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

South Field Energy LLC ("SFE") is proposing to construct an approximately 2-mile long natural gas pipeline in Columbiana County which would provide natural gas from a point of interconnect on Dominion Transmission Pipeline's natural gas pipeline to the South Field Energy Facility. The name of this new pipeline project is the South Field Energy Natural Gas Pipeline Interconnection (the "Interconnection"). The Interconnection will be a 20-inch diameter natural gas pipeline constructed within a right-of-way shared with a 345-kilovolt (kV) transmission line (the "T-Line") that will serve the South Field Energy Facility. Both the South Field Energy Facility and the SFE T-Line were the subject of a separate filings with the OPSB (Case Nos. 15-1716-EL-BGN and 15-1717-EL-BTX, respectively).

The following public officials and agencies have been served with copies of the Letter of Notification Application as required by the Ohio Power Siting Board's rules:

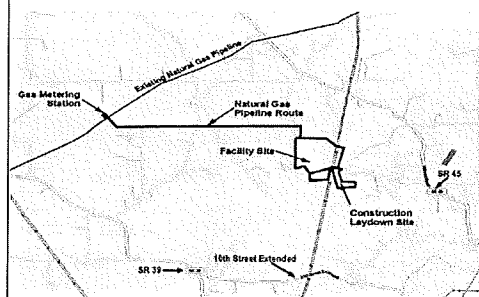
