A. I cited 392.82-1, use of a hand-held mobile telephone device while operating or driving a commercial motor vehicle.

The reason I cited him for, I was on the entrance ramp parked sideways, and park sideways so I can get a view of the trucks coming down the highway. I observed the driver coming down the highway using a hand-held communication device in his hand.

After he went by me I approached the vehicle, pulled alongside of the vehicle so I could confirm that he had actually had a communication device in his hand. Upon that, slowed down, pulled behind him, and pulled this vehicle over.

I slowed down and pulled him over and approached him and asked various questions like we do. First of all you haven't done anything wrong. This is an inspection, I am doing the inspection.

And I asked him about the using a hand-held communication device. I also put in my notes the conversation we had. And if I could read them to you.

"Driver was using a hand-held communication device while operating (driving) a commercial motor vehicle. Observed from stationary and driving beside the vehicle.

After stopping the driver he stated he was just reading the e-mail his company sent him. And that is how they communicate to the dispatch."

That is what he shared with me.

My notes confirm he was actually using a hand-held communication device while operating a commercial motor vehicle.

- Q. Did you see the device?
- A. Yes.

- Q. He showed it to you?
- A. In his hand, yes. I asked him like I ask them all. I used to take pictures of them, but I no longer take pictures of them with the numbers, unfortunately.
- Q. So if I can summarize correctly, you saw him as he was approaching you and you were sitting on the entrance ramp watching, and then you would have saw him still on the device when he passed you?
- 24 A. Yes.
- Q. And then as you approached him and

you stopped the vehicle and you opened the door you then saw the same device again?

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I asked him, yes, I communicated to Α. him the reason. I tell them all since it's not a consensual stop, the reason I stopped you for, you haven't done anything wrong.

Then I tell them the violation I saw and that's why I stopped him. And that is when he communicated to me that's the only way that they get dispatched, you know, that is how the dispatcher dispatched.

I thought if you need to see that you can pull over on the side of the road. Me personally and for him, that is dangerous while driving to operate a hand-held communication device.

- When he was driving down this road, how was the phone held? Was it held in front of his face?
- Α. Yes. I observed the phone in is hand (indicating). That is -- normally if they got it on the seat you can't tell unless you ask them to get out of traffic, pull beside him.

But if it's in their hand you can 25 clearly see. It's very simple. Where we sit we

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are just angled more. We actually come on the entrance ramp and turn sideways so actually look and get a good view, frontal view. Like with the seat belts you can clearly see.
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5 MR. EUBANKS: I have no further 6 questions for the witness.

the place you are picking up, or you are
receiving.

And the day that this happened they didn't have this fastened to the dash, but they do now. I laid it up on the dash of the truck, it come down in the floor and I picked it up and to make sure I was still on the drive line but I was new to the electronic log.

And the officer said that he knew I was on the phone because my lips was moving.

Well, I sing to the radio or anything, but I was sitting in my truck with the arm rest and that phone was like that (indicating). You know, this phone is nothing more than just a log book and gives us our address for where picking up or delivering things.

So, that is the reason they give me the paper to explain that it don't have them programs on it. It is all shut off. There is

- Q. Have you read this?
- A. I have.
- Q. This document?
- A. Yes.
  - Q. Were you -- at the time that you were coming down the highway and you had the phone in your hand were you using it to access the electronic logbook?
- A. No. If that truck is moving that logbook does not work. You can't change anything, you can't do nothing when that truck is moving. Because see how this works? This connects to the XYX box that is connected to the ECM. So when that truck is in motion there is no access of anything on it.
  - Q. So what were you looking at?
  - A. Right here (indicating). I would be happy to show you. Do you see this is Cellcom. This gives me my address where I am picking up or where I am delivering to. And this thing here on the dash, it falls to the floor. I pick it up.

1 And when you are going down 2 the road, right here is what you are going to see, that's the screen you will see. That is 3 the logbook. And I was making sure that this 4 5 right here where it's off duty, it should be a 6 D. Because I was all new to electronic log, I 7 just started with them and when it fell on the floor I pick it up, I am sitting in the seat 8 9 just like this. This hand on the steering 10 wheel, and my arm is on the arm rest. 11 I pick it up just like this 12 (indicating). Still on the drive line, going 13 back up here. 14 So it does work then. You can look 0. 15 at the screen when you are moving? Yes. The screen is always on when 16 Α. 17 it's moving. 18 Q. Okay. 19 The screen is always on when it's 20 moving.

- Q. All right. And you were reading the screen?
- A. I was making sure that said D instead of off.

Q. Okay. When the officer approached

you did you still have the phone in your hand?

A. Whenever he come up beside me -- I seen him setting on that ramp before I ever passed him. I seen him sitting on that ramp.

And when he come up beside me, yes,
I seen him. I seen him coming up beside me, but
as far as I was concerned I am not on the phone.
I picked it up off the floor. This is my
logbook and I would like to say, again, I was
new to electronic log, make sure I was on drive
line. I didn't know that I was doing anything
wrong.

- Q. But my question is did you have the phone in your hand at the time that the officer approached you?
- A. When he pulled me over?
  - Q. Yes.
- 18 A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. And do you agree with
  the officer's statement that you also had the
  phone in your hand as you were passing the
  officer?
- A. I am not going to agree to that
  because, like I say, I don't know -- it was
  laying on the dash, it fell on the floor. And

I can't imagine taking me that long to pick it up and laying on the dash. But, no, I don't agree with that.

- Q. So you only picked it up off the floor once the officer stopped you?
  - A. No, sir.

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- Q. When did you pick the phone off the floor?
- A. I seen the officer setting up on the ramp. Well, if you ever drove across there that road is like a washboard. And this thing was laying on the dash. It falls down, I picked it up probably approximately at the time I am passing the ramp that he is setting on.

You know, but I can't tell you exactly the inch where I was at when I picked it up because I don't know.

- Q. But you would have had the phone at some point when you were passing in your hand?
- A. I had my logbook in my hand, yes, sir, whenever he was coming up beside me.
- MR. EUBANKS: Okay. I have no further questions.
- 24 ATTORNEY EXAMINER: Do you have 25 anything else to add in the way of conclusion of

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this case, your part of the case?
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MR. JONES: I don't. I just don't care about paying the money if that is what you want, but the points that I am going to get off of this is going to ruin my job for me, when I didn't do anything to, you know.

If they are talking about me having this phone in my hand, I will not sit and lie and tell you I didn't because I did pick it up off the floor. But I was not using this phone. It don't work when it is going down the road.

- 12 All you can see is that screen right there.
- 13 And it stays on all the time.
- It will be white up here, says in

  motion, and it don't work when it goes down the

  road.
- So there is nothing more that I can add.
