



DP&L requested an increase of its revenue requirement by \$65.7 million. In addition, DP&L requests to establish three new riders: the Uncollectible Rider, allowing the company to recover the actual amount of bad debt costs instead of an estimate in base rates; the Regulatory Compliance Rider, allowing recovery of costs associated with unforeseen regulatory changes; and the Storm Cost Recovery Rider, to allow recovery of costs incurred as a result of major storms.

I have been informed that this request would increase my customer charge by more than 300% and that I would be charged this regardless of my energy consumption. My energy costs continue to rise even as I implement energy efficiencies. I do not believe that we should each have this additional cost because of DP&L's poor cost and contingency planning.

I am writing as a concerned customer and citizen. I am strongly opposed to DP&L's plan to increase the customer charge. As an electric service, it is in their duties to stay up to date on technology and run as green and cost effective as possible.
