MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

On February 29, 2016, the Ohio Edison Company, the Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company, and the Toledo Edison Company (collectively, the Companies) filed a grid modernization business plan (Plan) with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (Commission).¹ The Companies state that the Plan is filed as part of a commitment made in its fourth electric security plan proceeding² and is "an important step to advance and modernize the Companies' electric distribution delivery system throughout their respective service territories."³ The Plan presents three scenarios for further consideration and utilizes various types of technology including Advanced Distribution Management System (ADMS), Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI), Integrated Volt/VAR Control (IVVC), and Distribution Automation (DA).⁴ While the Plan fails to specify the expected costs to customers, the Companies state that costs incurred in implementing the Plan will be recovered through Rider AMI, which will be updated

and reconciled on a quarterly basis.⁵ Further, the Companies propose a return on equity of 10.38% with an additional 50 basis points.⁶

Rule 4901-1-1, Ohio Administrative Code, permits intervention by a party who has a real and substantial interest in the proceeding and who is so situated that the disposition of the proceeding may impair or impede its ability to protect that interest and whose interest is not adequately represented by an existing party. Additionally, Section 4903.221, Revised Code, authorizes intervention where a party: may be adversely affected by the proceeding; will contribute to a full development and equitable resolution of factual issues; and will not unduly prolong or delay the proceedings.

The Ohio Manufacturers' Association Energy Group (OMAEG) is a non-profit entity that strives to improve business conditions in Ohio and drive down the cost of doing business for Ohio manufacturers. OMAEG works directly with elected officials, regulatory agencies, the judiciary, and the media to provide education and information to energy consumers, regulatory boards and suppliers of energy; advance energy policies to promote an adequate, reliable, and efficient supply of energy at reasonable prices; and advocate in critical cases before the Commission. OMAEG members purchase electric power services from the Companies, have previously participated in proceedings involving the Companies,⁷ and will be affected by the Commission's determination in this proceeding.

Because OMAEG satisfies the criteria set forth in Section 4903.221, Revised Code and Rule 4901-1-11, Ohio Administrative Code, it is authorized to intervene with the full powers and rights granted by the Commission to intervening parties. OMAEG respectfully requests that the Commission grant this motion for leave to intervene and that OMAEG be made a full party of record.
