NOTICE OF PROPOSED MAJOR UTILITY FACILITY

AEP Ohio Transmission Company Inc. (AEP Ohio Transco) proposes to rebuild a 138-kilovolt (KV) transmission line in York Township in Athens County and Green Townships in Hocking County.

The purpose of the Poston-Good Hope 138-KV Transmission Line Rebuild Number 2 Project is to rebuild an existing 138-KV transmission line within existing right of way. This project will help improve and maintain electric service reliability in south central Ohio. AEP Ohio Transco will build the new line using standard single-pole, steel structures. The overall Poston-Good Hope transmission line is about 25 miles long. This project will rebuild about half of this line. This project will be an approximate \$15 million investment by AEP Ohio Transco. Construction is scheduled to begin in November 2016.

The project is known as the Poston-Good Hope 138-KV Transmission Line Rebuild Number 2 Project. AEP Ohio Transco has filed a Letter of Notification with the Ohio Power Siting Board, under Case No. 16-1770-EL-BLN. This number should be included in all communications with respect to this project. The Letter of Notification to construct, operate and maintain this facility is pending before the board.

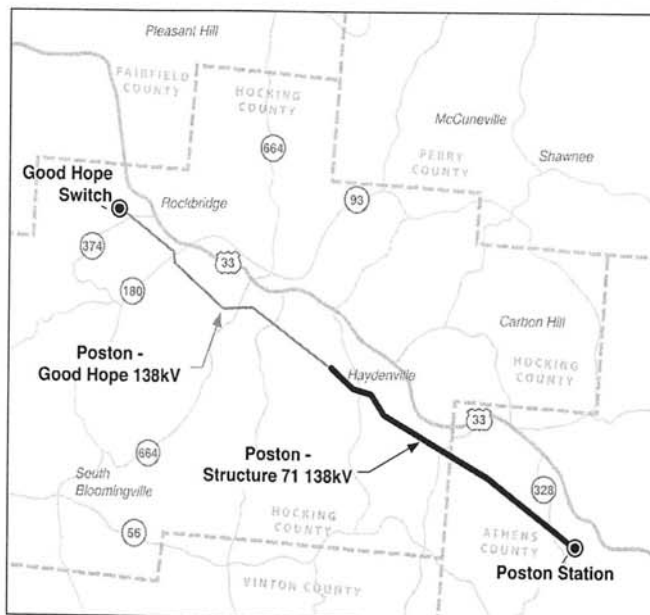
Petitions to intervene in the Letter of Notification will be accepted by the siting board up to 10 days following the publication date of this notice required by Rule 4906-2-12, Ohio Administrative Code. Petitions should be addressed to Ohio Power Siting Board, 180 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215-3793 and must cite Case No. 16-1770-EL-BLN.

A.J. Green's 1-handed catch in scrum shows off his juggling

CINCINNATI — A.J. Green took up juggling when he was in grade school, learning how to juggle and catch all sorts of things without dropping them. It was fun and developed his coordination. Now, anything near his fingertips seems to stick.

The Bengals receiver pulled off one of the most amazing plays of the season during a 31-17 win over the Browns on Sunday.

In the middle of a scrum in the end zone, he jumped, tipped a desperation pass to himself, and pulled it in with one hand while being pulled down.

His 48-yard touchdown on the last play of the first half put the Bengals (3-4) in control and left everyone amazed.

No matter how many times they watched the play again on video, his teammates couldn't help but marvel.

Later, Green beat a defender down the right sideline and made another one-handed catch for another 48-yard gain. On that one, he was looking back into the sun and didn't see the ball until the last instant, forcing him to take a stab at it with one hand.

He's been getting pretty much everything in what's shaping up as his best season yet. Green, a first-round pick in 2011, leads the NFL with 50 catches and is second to Atlanta's Julio Jones in yards receiving with 775. He's got two of the top 10 games in yards receiving this season at 180 and 173.

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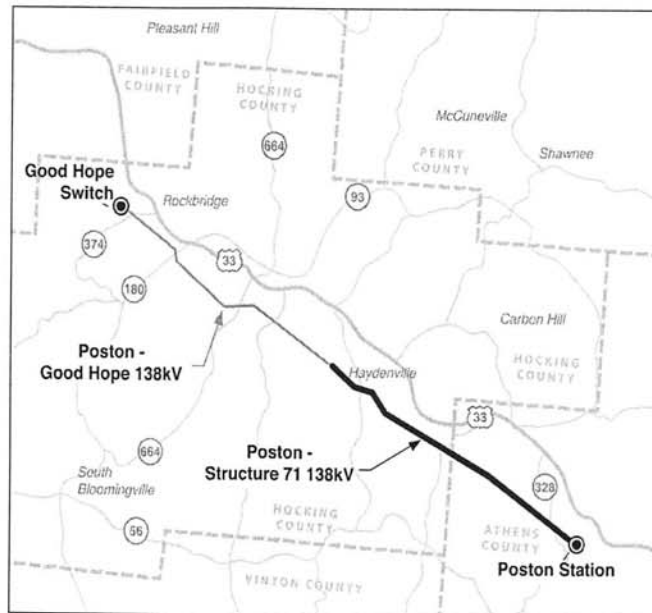
