

As a customer of the electricity monopoly in Columbus Ohio, American Electric Power (AEP) does not encourage me to save electricity. I have already replaced all my incandescent lamps with LED or CFLs, and I light only the room I am in. I minimize my use of air conditioning in the summer, and when I run the AC at night I set the temperature to 80 degrees. I placed a small window air conditioner in the bedroom window and do NOT cool my entire home. During the winter I keep the house at 55 degrees when I am not home and during the night. A warm house is 65 degrees -- and I wear a sweater.


AEP now proposes to more than double the "Customer Charge" for my privilege of being connected to the electrical grid. This is outrageous for a utility regulated by the PUCO. I do not oppose profits for a utility, but there is no risk involved when bad decisions are made by its management. When times are good they make a profit. When times are bad, they raise my costs and still make a profit.

Instead of promoting fossil fuel energy generation AEP should be leading the push to renewable energy and efficiency. AEP's decision to stick with coal-powered generation should be passed onto its stockholders with smaller dividends, and not its customers.

I work hard to conserve energy and these increased customer charges punish me for my efforts. I am fortunate to be able to pay my bills on time. Who is looking out for those on a fixed income or not as lucky as I am to have a decent job?

I would welcome any advice from AEP on how I can further save energy. I would advise AEP to stop punishing those who try to save electrical energy by managing our usage and minimizing our environmental impact.
